Quick Guide to Courses

Use this quick guide to choose your correct course. Please note that unless otherwise stated, all references to licence categories refer to motorcycle licences, i.e. categories 'P', 'A1' and 'A'.

Your new licence:

The course you must take:

You have a new provisional licence and never ridden before] ───►	Before you can lawfully ride on the public highway, you must take the full CBT course. Book online at www.gmts.gg.
You have renewed your provisional licence in the <u>same</u> category as your previous licence without a break.	│ →	You must take a Direct Access ('DA') course within one month of the start date of your new licence, unless you have changed the type of bike you are using from an automatic (e.g. scooter) to a geared bike and in which case you must do the full CBT course. Book online at www.gmts.gg.
You have renewed your provisional licence in a <u>different</u> category as your previous licence (with or without a break). You have a new provisional licence in the same category as your previous licence with a break of at least one year.		You may take the shortened, Direct Access ('DA') course, unless you have changed the type of bike you are using from an automatic (e.g. scooter) to a geared bike and in which case you must do the full CBT course. Book online at www.gmts.gg.
You have a new provisional licence in category 'A' but have held a full 'A1' category licence for at least one year.]	You do not need to do a CBT course.
You are about to take your practical driving test and would benefit from one or two hours of refresher training.		GMTS offer one to one training, ideal if you are about to take your practical driving test or planning on an 'Off-Island Tour' for the first time. Book on line at www.gmts.gg.

CBT courses are normally held each weekend at St Peter Port Campus (old St PP School). All courses must be pre-booked.

When attending your course you must bring a valid licence and current insurance certificate with you. This is in addition to the insurance 'windscreen display' which should be attached to the bike.
