Social Welfare Benefits Investigation Committee Comprehensive Social Welfare Benefits Model

In Proposition 1 to insert immediately after “subject to funding being available,” the following: “and subject to Proposition 1A”; and to insert a Proposition 1A as follows:

“1A. To agree that their decisions in respect of Proposition 1 shall be subject to the Committee *for* Employment & Social Security reviewing the short term rates in paragraph 87 against the current Social Policy Plan’s general objective of “equality of opportunity, social inclusion and social justice” and any relevant policies in the new Policy and Resource Plan; taking into consideration the differences between the proposed rates and the current short term rates and those proposed in the Modernisation of Supplementary Benefit Scheme Policy Letters in 2012 and 2013 and the latest measurement of relative poverty.”.

Explanatory Note and Rule 15(2) information

Carrying out the investigation proposed in this amendment will not increase the expenditure of the States.

The effect of this amendment is that the Committee *for* Employment & Social Security will have to review the short term rates before bringing a proposition to the States.

The table on the next page shows the proposed short term rates compared to 2015 rates and the rates proposed in the Modernisation of Supplementary Benefit Scheme Policy Letters in 2012 and 2013.

To insert at the end of the words in Proposition 1b. “, except that the single non-householder long-term requirement rate shall be £128.63 (instead of £105.16)”.

Explanatory Note and Rule 15(2) information

The effect of this amendment is that the long-term ‘single non-householder’ requirement rate would be calculated by reference to the long-term ‘single householder’ requirement rate.

The rate of £128.63 proposed by this amendment has been calculated by deducting the relevant ‘housing’ and ‘household goods and services’ costs in Appendix 1 from the long-term single householder rate of £170.69.

The long-term non-householder rate proposed in Billet VII has been calculated by adding a £5 transport allowance to the long-term rate for a young person aged 11-18.

The financial implications for the States of carrying this amendment into effect are none.
