# WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING SITES CHARGING GUIDANCE AND CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTANCE, 2016

This document is provided for site users and staff to provide helpful guidance in relation to charges for acceptance of waste at public waste management sites. The document provides guidance as to the sorts of waste the Waste Disposal Authority (WDA) considers are included in particular descriptions of waste but cannot be exhaustive as to what is included in each description. Words and expressions used in this guidance reflect the provisions of the Regulations under which the charges are made: the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2015. It includes other guidance on related matters.

The document also sets which waste can be disposed of or recovered at particular sites<sup>1</sup> and includes certain conditions subject to which waste is accepted at particular sites<sup>2</sup>. Weighbridge categories and relevant charge rates for sites reserved for the disposal and recovery of particular types of waste are included as Appendix 2.

This guidance was last updated on 17th December, 2015 and reflects the relevant legislation in force as at 1st January, 2016.

# APPENDIX 1 <u>SUMMARY OF WASTE DISPOSAL SITES & CHARGES, 2016</u> SITES RESERVED FOR DISPOSAL OR RECOVERY OF PARTICULAR TYPES OF WASTE

### 1. Mont Cuet Landfill Site. Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:00 – 16:00, Sat: 07:00 – 10:00

Household and Commercial waste, or a mixture of such wastes, including wastes with no alternative disposal or recycling route, such as litter etc., and commercial green waste for composting. Some Specially Controlled Wastes are also disposed of at Mont Cuet, including asbestos, contaminated spoil and chemicals. Specific arrangements are required for the disposal of these specially controlled wastes.

In order to preserve void space at Mont Cuet Landfill Site and encourage recycling, certain items/materials should not be included in loads delivered to Mont Cuet Landfill Site. Loads containing these items/materials are classified as 'Contaminated', with a higher charge applied. No loads will be reloaded after tipping at Mont Cuet.

2. Longue Hougue Reclamation Site: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:30 – 16:45, Sat: 07:00 – 10:00 Inert Waste, substantially free of vegetation (<1%). Top soil with turf/vegetation is also accepted for stockpiling and processing.

**3.** Chouet Horticultural Site: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:00 – 16:00, Sat/Sun: 08:00 – 17:00 Non-commercial green waste. Free disposal to private householder deliveries.

#### 4. Fontaine Vinery Waste Segregation Facility: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 09:00 – 15:00,

Mixed loads of commercial waste, household waste or a mixture of the same not containing putrescible or Specially Controlled Waste. Segregated commercial loads of recyclables (Glass, Tins/Cans, and Plastic Bottles, <u>NOT</u> cardboard and paper) and excluding Parish recyclables. Such waste delivered by or on behalf of Parishes may include paper and cardboard. Cash is <u>NOT</u> accepted at this site.

#### 5. States Works, La Hure Mare: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:00 – 16:00

Commercial deliveries of Expanded Polystyrene (EPS), clean and dry. A ticket must first be obtained from one of the States Waste weighbridges. EPS food and drink containers and packaging peanuts are not accepted.

#### APPENDIX 3 GENERAL PRINCIPLES FOR APPLYING CONTAMINATION CHARGES AT MONT CUET LANDFILL SITE

The principle behind the charging of contaminated loads is to reduce the volume of waste delivered to Mont Cuet, thereby diverting waste from landfill to more appropriate recycling or land reclamation alternatives.

A Contaminated Load is a mixed waste load that contains Specially Controlled Waste, inert waste and/or items or materials that have an alternative recycling or disposal route.

The 'Contamination Rate' is applied to mixed waste loads which contain quantities of contaminants (as defined in the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2015) that can reasonably be segratated or recycled.

Each load received at Mont Cuet Landfill Site is assessed by the landfill site operator. A load is classified as contaminated if the amount of the specified items or materials within the mixed load is sufficient to render the load contaminated in accordance with the legislation.

The load shall be classed as contaminated if it is clear that the specified items/materials could reasonably have been separated from the other waste and diverted to alternative recycling or disposal routes.

Where a contaminated load is identified on the weighbridge the waste carrier shall be offered the opportunity by the weighbridge operator to leave the site and deliver the waste to the most appropriate waste or recycling facility.

Minor amounts of cardboard, plastic, paper, etc. would not render a load as contaminated. Similarly, materials that ordinarily could be recycled but are contaminated by food wastes or other 'contaminants', rendering them un-recyclable, would not be classed as contaminated; however, the disposal of loads of cardboard, paper or clear plastic film contaminated or spoiled prior to, or during collection, will only be accepted by prior approval of the Waste Disposal Authority.

The decision to classify a load as contaminated, in accordance with the legislation, is made by the landfill operators, who are trained to identify such loads. Loads classified as contaminated shall be photographed with the date and time indicated on the photograph. Where practical the photograph should include the vehicle depositing the contaminated load. The reason for the contamination charge should be entered in the comments box on the weighbridge ticket.

Objections against a contaminated load charge should be directed in writing to the Waste Disposal Authority.

#### APPENDIX 4 WASTE ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT (WEEE)

Categories of WEEE are defined in the European Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive 2012/19/EU. Annex 1 and 2 are reproduced below for convenience. These Annexes will be replaced by Annex 3 and 4 of the Directive from 15 August 2018.
