## **JOINED UP GOVERNMENT - BUILDING ON THE WORK DONE**

We have an amazing wealth of knowledge and experience on our island in business, the Civil Service, the Douzaine, the voluntary sector and many other places – let's benefit from it. I want to work together to build on what has been achieved and not waste further time and money going over old ground. The States have been criticised for spending 80% of their time working out the last 20% of a plan to get it just right. If elected I will push ahead with the best plans for Guernsey and discourage procrastination.

## **DOING BUSINESS IN GUERNSEY**

We need to continue to embrace innovation and the digital world both in the private sector and the States. Guernsey can adapt easily to new approaches as it has strong regulatory, legal and political systems and I would encourage this. Whilst I am a supporter of the finance industry, I believe the States also needs to promote other industries such as tourism, construction and retail. A clear policy is also needed for the islands' transport links to maintain and improve the Bailiwick's reputation as a great place to live, visit and do business.

## **EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY**

We need to strive to remove the barriers that still exist and acknowledge the inequalities in health and in wealth in our population. If elected, I would support policies that achieve such aims. Anti-discrimination legislation and equality in access to information and services is needed and I would continue to support initiatives which benefit the Bailiwick.

Diversity is also needed in all States' activities and the community as a whole. If elected, I would support policies which encourage this in politics and the workplace. We especially need an Assembly which reflects the population and benefits from diverse, innovative and effective policy making.



## OUR YOUNG PEOPLE - GUERNSEY'S FUTURE

The recent decision by the States to get rid of the 11+ will lead the way to levelling the playing field for the children of the Bailiwick. However, the challenge will be to ensure the decision to move to three high schools in Guernsey results in as few children are affected for the least time.

We need an Education Policy which gets the best out of all of our young people and supports our teachers. I will work hard to ensure that this means all the Bailiwick's children are stretched, whatever their talents or special needs and whatever age they develop, and they receive an education which gives them the skills for the career of their choice in the 21st Century.

## PAYING THE BILLS

Due to the increase in those needing the services, we should ensure value for money in the public sector. However, if elected, I will support policies because they will be the best outcome for Guernsey and not just because they are the cheapest option.

We also need to consider all types of direct and indirect taxation but I would only support adoption or amendment of a tax if it was fair to the taxpayer, kept us competitive and it was cost effective to administer. Changes to our current corporate tax regime may be required in the future to keep pace with the international view. However, I do not agree with a wholesale change to a territorial tax system as it would mean uncertainty for our finance industry. Also, I believe GST is not appropriate or proportionate as it would be an undue burden on our businesses.

## PROMOTING GUERNSEY AND DEMOCRACY

I believe we should encourage democracy, discourage apathy and introduce the means to do both such as the introduction of Island wide voting.
