### Article II

## The Waste Food Ordinance, 1987

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 27th day of May, 1987, hereby order:—

# Prohibition on feeding waste food.

- 1. No person shall—
  - (a) feed waste food, or supply waste food for feeding, to any livestock or poultry; or
  - (b) cause or permit waste food to be so fed or supplied.

### Offences.

2. A person who contravenes section 1 is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £500.

#### Interpretation.

- 3. In this Ordinance—
- "livestock" means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;
- "poultry" means all species of fowl, turkey, goose, duck, guinea fowl, pigeon, pheasant, partridge and quail;
- "waste food" means-
  - (a) meat, bones, blood, offal or any other part of the carcase of any animal or bird, or any product derived therefrom;
  - (b) hatchery waste, eggs or eggshells;
  - (c) any broken or waste foodstuffs, including table or kitchen scraps, which contain or have been in contact with anything mentioned in (a) or (b).

- 4. This Ordinance has effect in the Islands of Extent. Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.
- 5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Waste Citation. Food Ordinance, 1987.
- 6. This Ordinance shall come into operation on Commencethe 1st day of January, 1988.
