

*Article II***The Waste Food Ordinance, 1987**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 27th day of May, 1987, hereby order:—

Prohibition
on feeding
waste food.

1. No person shall—

- (a) feed waste food, or supply waste food for feeding, to any livestock or poultry; or
- (b) cause or permit waste food to be so fed or supplied.

Offences.

2. A person who contravenes section 1 is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £500.

Interpreta-
tion.

3. In this Ordinance—

“livestock” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“poultry” means all species of fowl, turkey, goose, duck, guinea fowl, pigeon, pheasant, partridge and quail;

“waste food” means—

- (a) meat, bones, blood, offal or any other part of the carcass of any animal or bird, or any product derived therefrom;
- (b) hatchery waste, eggs or eggshells;
- (c) any broken or waste foodstuffs, including table or kitchen scraps, which contain or have been in contact with anything mentioned in (a) or (b).

4. This Ordinance has effect in the Islands of Extent. Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Waste Citation. Food Ordinance, 1987.

6. This Ordinance shall come into operation on Commencement. the 1st day of January, 1988.
