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THE BID DOCUMENT

A FORMAL APPLICATION TO HOST THE NATWEST ISLAND GAMES IN 2021

The Bailiwick of Guernsey is a Crown Dependency in the English Channel, off the coast of Normandy. The Bailiwick embraces not only all ten parishes on the island of Guernsey, but also the much smaller inhabited islands of Alderney, Sark, Herm, Jethou and Lihou together with many small islets and rocks.

The Bailiwick of Guernsey is not part of the United Kingdom. However, defence and most foreign relations are handled by the British Government.

The Bailiwick lies within the Common Travel Area of the British Isles and is not a member of the European Union, but has a special relationship with it, being treated as part of the European Community for the purposes of free trade in goods.

The two Bailiwicks of Guernsey and Jersey together form the geographical grouping known as the Channel Islands.

Our main town and capital is St Peter Port. With its cobbled streets and picturesque seafront marina and historic gardens, it is easy to see why St Peter Port is considered one of Europe's prettiest harbour towns.



Guernsey's capital has been a busy port since Roman times. Castle Cornet has stood guard over the town for 800 years. Once cut off by the tide, it now provides a spectacular backdrop to the town as well as staging theatre productions and musical events.



St Peter Port's centrepiece is its beautiful church, which is believed to be the closest church to a public house in the British Isles.

Guernsey has a proud tradition of support for the Island Games both as a competitor and as a host. As such, the Island has twice been a former host of the Island Games, once in 1987, and again in 2003. Many facilities for hosting the Games are already suitable for hosting a top class Games, and the island is lucky enough to continue to benefit from significant capital investment that was undertaken for the 2003 Games. This includes a fully refurbished Sports Centre capable of hosting the sports of swimming, squash, volleyball and/or basketball. In addition, the national stadium, 'Footes Lane' has the ability to host the sports of football and athletics with a 800 seat purpose build stadium, associated high performance gym, VIP function rooms and dedicated bar.

The support of the Island community is obviously paramount to the success of the Games, and interest in the 2021 Games is already gathering pace. In addition, the various sports associations on the island are very experienced in the staging of events and a large number of committed sports administrators, officials and coaches donate their time to assist in the further development of individual sports. The majority have been involved with previous Games, either as competitors, volunteers or officials, providing a wealth of knowledge.

Recent Games have enjoyed increasingly high standards of facilities and competition, whilst not losing sight of the Island Games principles of encouraging friendship through sporting activities and providing opportunities to participate in international sport. These principles continue to direct the efforts of Guernsey to secure the 2021 Games for Guernsey.

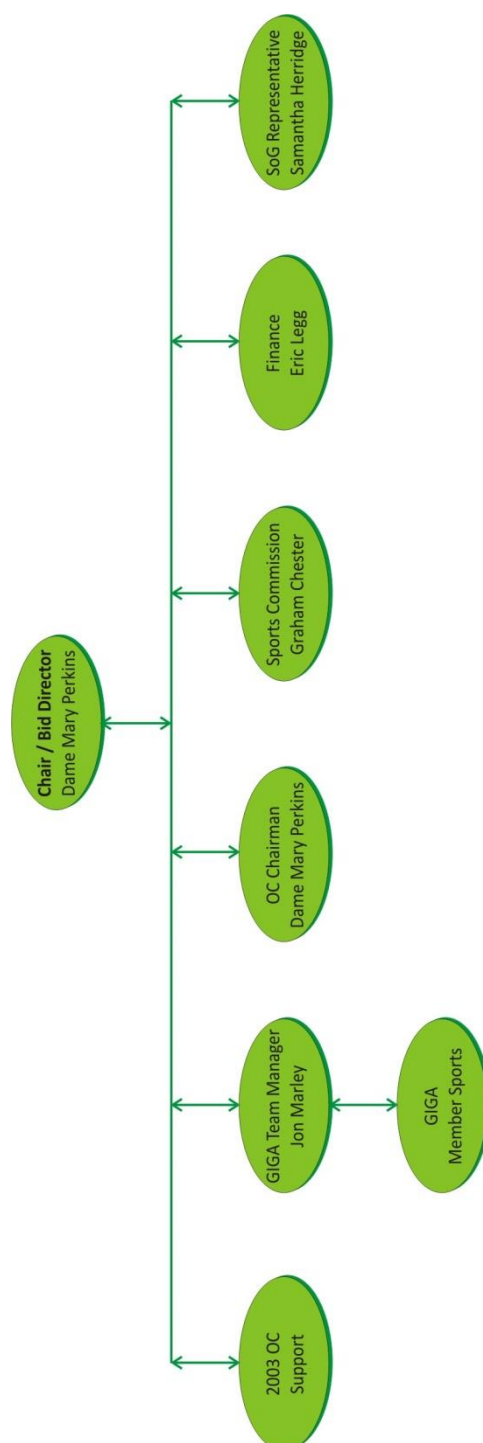

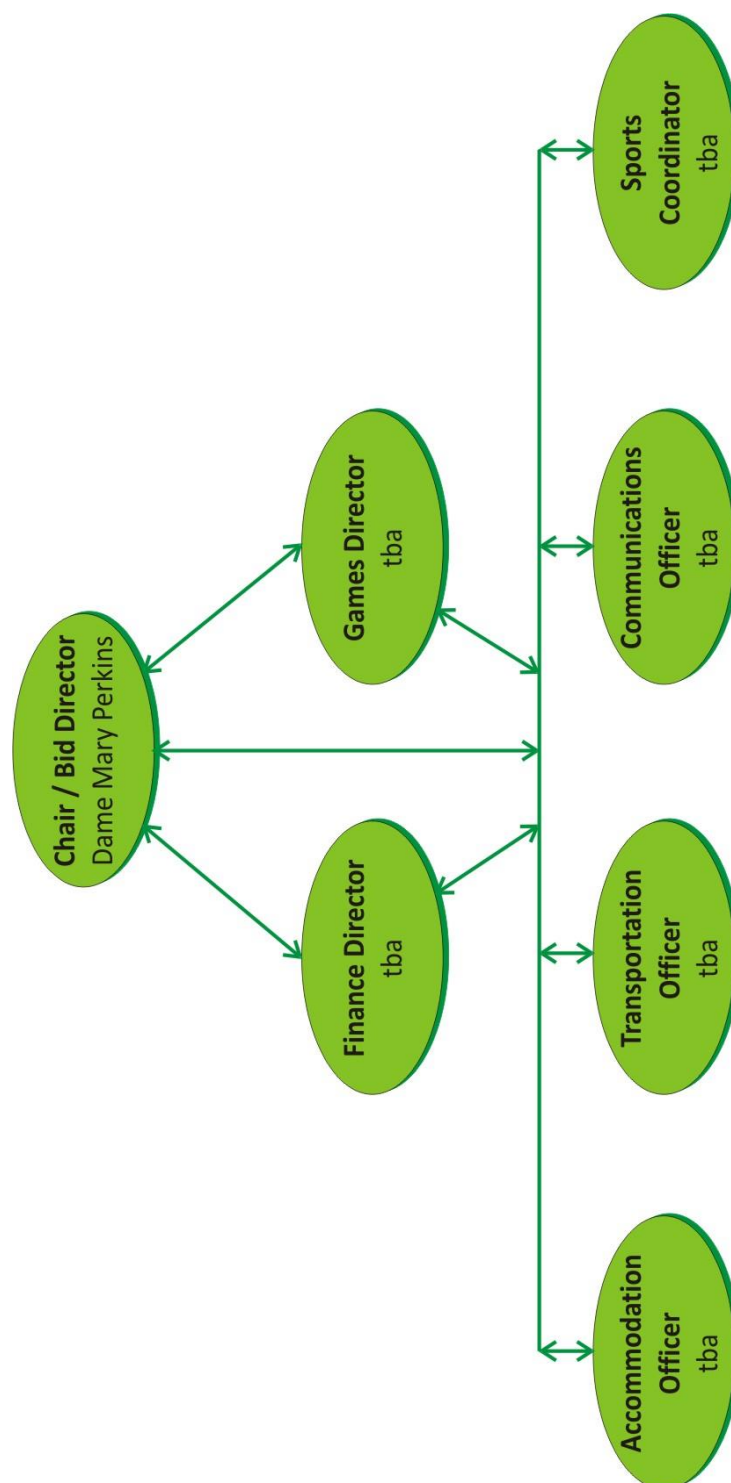

Medical

There are no reciprocal arrangements in place for medical with the exception of the Channel Islands, and all competitors would be advised to take out separate and appropriate medical insurance cover.

There is one hospital on the island, including Accident and Emergency facilities. In addition, St Johns Ambulance Service provide emergency response.

Political

There is an island wide election taking place in May 2016, although indications are that this bid is supported by all current politicians. There are no party political affiliations on the Island, and all past (and present) administrations have valued sport and its role in the community and have shown this through constant substantial financial support in both infrastructure and development needs, including the funding of participation at international events.

Volunteers

Each individual sport on the Island is self-governing and all are run and administered by passionate volunteers. The Guernsey population as a whole is engaged, passionate and proud of its sporting heritage and it is hoped this goodwill will transfer into a solid volunteer base for the Games. For the 2003 Games, the Island was able to call on over 1,400 volunteers, who were prepared to commit themselves to the effort required to make the Games a success.

How do you propose encouraging local support for the Games?

With an island population of c65k, Guernsey still retains a strong sense of community and local support will be garnered from social media, the local media, and requests through various sporting and non-sporting associations.

What do you see as the biggest legacy of holding the Games?

We are currently looking to host a variety of different sports amongst the various islands of the Bailiwick – two of which are member islands of the IIGA. We feel this is an effective way of engaging smaller islands who are unable to host a Games on their own. Details to be confirmed.

Guernsey successfully hosted the 2003 Island Games, and in addition to this each individual sport has hosted several high class competitions. Examples such as the National Hill Climb Championships, the International Masters Swim meet, National Hockey and Table Tennis Festivals demonstrate Guernsey's ability to rise to the occasion.

The local media includes BBC Television and Radio, Channel Island Television (ITV – IIGA Official Broadcaster), along with smaller media outlets such as the Guernsey Press (local daily paper) and Island FM (Commercial radio station). All are fully supportive of sport on the Islands and supported the 2003 Island Games.

It would be hoped to concentrate the media centre in one central location to create a real community spirit, and avoid separating the media according to their disciplines. This would be supported by two satellite mini venue media centres at strategic locations. It is hoped that users will benefit from 24 hours access as well as adequate catering facilities. Wi-fi will be available throughout with enough bandwidth for computers, smartphones and tablets. Printers, fax machines and landlines will also be available in case of unanticipated interruptions to service. Pre-pay mobile phones may also be supplied to all accredited media staff. Technical support will be provided throughout.

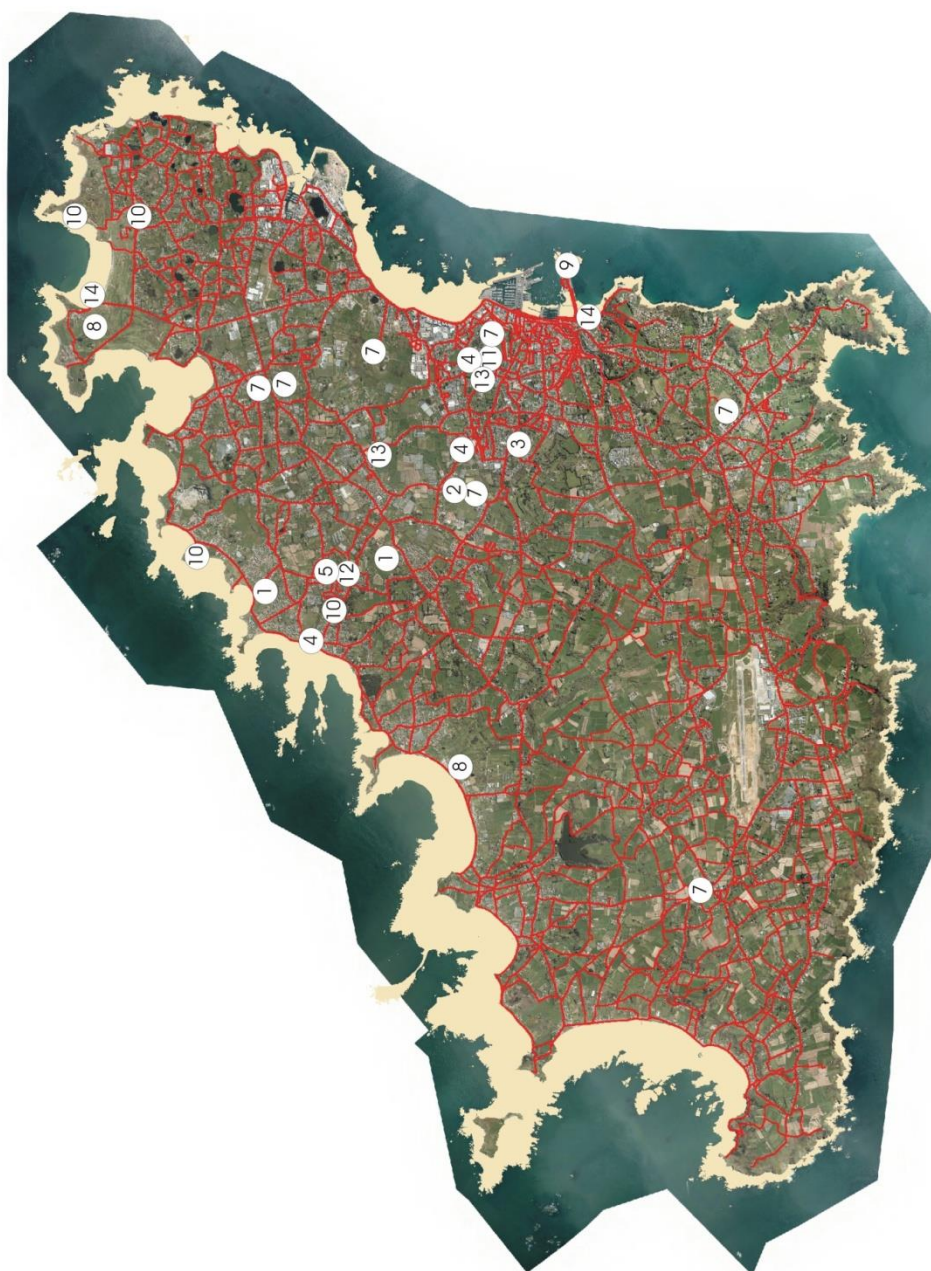

Spectator Accommodation (inc total capacity) State temporary or permanent.	Footes Lane stand seats 800 with additional space on grass bank and standing outside of railings

Venue Name	The Guernsey Pearl Badminton Hall Rohais, St Peter Port, Guernsey
Details of Venue	Purpose built badminton venue comprising a top hall with 5 courts and a lower hall with 3 courts. All courts are sprung. The 2 halls are linked by a corridor with a view gallery looking down into the lower hall. There is a small canteen which would be used to provide food during the games and bar/lounge area which would be used during the Games for players and spectators.
Changing Accommodation	Mens and ladies changing rooms with showers and toilets. Power points for hair dryers and a permanent dryer in the ladies. There are also separate toilets away from the changing areas.
Spectator Accommodation (inc total capacity) State temporary or permanent.	Spectator seating is generally just seats at back/sides of courts, through the windows from the bar/canteen into the top hall and through the corridor windows down into the lower hall. When we hosted the Games in 2003 we set up temporary seating in both halls and I would anticipate that some 400 could be seated in this way for the 2021 Games.
Are Facilities ready now to hold sport?	Yes although we would undertake some maintenance and decoration, replace nets etc in the lead up to the Games. Likewise the temporary seating and mats would need to be brought in.
