NOTES:

- 1. Storage of most explosives requires a licence from the Royal Court. You should instruct an Advocate at the earliest opportunity to avoid delays.
- 2. You may otherwise apply for a Gunpowder Certificate for the storage of a small quantity of gunpowder (under 2lb) for making your own cartridges or for muzzle loaded licensed firearms. This is only considered when you hold a firearms or shotgun certificate from Guernsey Police, or when you are a registered firearms dealer.
- 3. You should provide a floor plan and drawings of the proposed location with your application.

4. Classification of Explosives

Class I - Includes gun powder and all explosives used in commercial blasting.

Class II - Fulminates of mercury and silver.

Class III - Ammunition containing its own means of ignition.

Class IV - Detonators (plain or electric)

Class V - Fireworks, flares, pyrotechnics etc.
