The Bailiwick of Guernsey Curriculum

Parents of Music Centre students who attend States schools may well be aware of the development of a new Bailiwick of Guernsey Curriculum. The Music Service has thoroughly reviewed its teaching schemes in the light of this development.

The subject of music, providing it is properly taught, provides excellent opportunities for pupils to develop as confident individuals, successful learners, responsible citizens and effective communicators: for example, pupils learn the importance of teamwork through their group music-making and develop communication skills through a carefully planned series of performances. There are some areas that we would like to develop further. Pupils will have more opportunities to enjoy expressing themselves through creative improvisation and composing activities. There will be more opportunities for self-directed chamber music as this is a very effective medium for pupils to take more responsibility for their own learning. Several older, more experienced pupils now help with younger ensembles and this is a good way in which they can develop as responsible citizens. Some opt to do this as part of their Duke of Edinburgh Award. We encourage others to come forward as their contribution would be very much welcomed.

Our young musicians should also recognise the responsibility that they have towards others through their availability for rehearsals and important performances. The conditions of registration include that the Service should be notified in writing, by email or telephone if a student is unable to attend Music Centre rehearsals and to take note of concert and Open Morning dates. Parents are required to excuse pupils from rehearsals and in writing at least six weeks in advance of performances. Please find overleaf details of forthcoming performances and dates, most of which have already been included in previous newsletters.

Staff and pupils will be sorry to say goodbye to James Hatton who is leaving his position as Brass Teacher with the Music Service at the end of this term to take up a new position at the Jerudong International School in Brunei where he will meet up again with Mr Ellul who moved from Guernsey to the same school. We also said goodbye to Lorraine Bonnel, our Administrative Assistant, a few weeks ago who worked very successfully alongside Sue Tostevin-Hall in the Music Centre office for three years. We are pleased to welcome Vicky Cole to this position.
