

# WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING SITES

## CHARGING GUIDANCE AND CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTANCE, 2018

This document is provided for site users and staff to provide helpful guidance in relation to charges for acceptance of waste at public waste management sites. The document provides guidance as to the sorts of waste the Waste Disposal Authority considers are included in particular descriptions of waste but cannot be exhaustive as to what is included in each description. Words and expressions used in this guidance reflect the provisions of the Regulations under which the charges are made: the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2017. It includes other guidance on related matters.

The document also sets which waste can be disposed of or recovered at particular sites<sup>1</sup> and includes certain conditions subject to which waste is accepted at particular sites<sup>2</sup>. Weighbridge categories and relevant charge rates for sites reserved for the disposal and recovery of particular types of waste are included as Appendix 2.

### 1. Mont Cuet Landfill Site

Waste is charged by weight, based on the net tonnage of the load.</p> <p><b>Conditions of Acceptance.</b>            Loads delivered to Mont Cuet should not contain quantities of specially controlled waste and items/materials that can reasonably be segregated or recycled i.e. have alternative recycling or disposal routes.</p> <p>The disposal of loads containing items/materials which can reasonably be segregated/ recycled and have an alternative disposal/ recycling route but are contaminated or spoiled prior to, or during collection, will only be accepted by prior approval of the Waste Disposal Authority</p>	<p>Standard Rate for Mont Cuet Landfill Site.            2018: £222.42/t, subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.</p>

<p><b>1.2 Household Waste or Commercial Waste or a mixture of such waste, containing quantities of 'Contaminants' that can reasonably be segregated or recycled</b></p>	<p><b>What is included?</b> A mixed waste load that contains Specially Controlled Waste or contains quantities of items/materials (including certain inert waste) that can reasonably be segregated or recycled i.e. have an alternative recycling or disposal route, (See Appendix 3 for additional information on the application of contamination charges at Mont Cuet Landfill Site).</p> <p>Items/materials which can reasonably be segregated/ recycled and have an alternative disposal/ recycling route are specified below.</p> <p><b>i). Tyres: All tyres originating from motorised vehicles (i.e. cars, vans, lorries, motorbikes). Excludes electric bicycles. Recycling Route: Sarnia Autos.</b></p> <p><b>ii). 1.3 Specially Controlled Waste	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Specially Controlled Wastes are wastes identified under waste legislation<sup>3</sup> that are dangerous, or difficult to treat, keep or dispose of. Because of their physical, chemical or biological properties, these wastes require special provisions for their disposal.</b></p> <p>The management and disposal of Specially Controlled Waste is regulated by the Director of Environmental Health and Pollution Regulation (contact at the Office of Environmental Health and Pollution Regulation (OEHPR)), who must be notified of the presence of Specially Controlled waste at any premises subject to certain exemptions. Certain Specially Controlled Wastes, not accepted for disposal at Mont Cuet Landfill Site, may be disposed of in the UK under a Duly Reasoned Request (DRR); waste shipments to the UK have to comply with the Transfrontier Shipment of Waste Ordinance, 2002 applying in Guernsey and the requirements of EU waste shipment legislation in relation to the import into the UK/Europe.</p> <p>The Guernsey Health &amp; Safety Executive carry out collections and storage of certain Specially Controlled Waste prior to disposal, either on or off island.</p> <p><b>Condition of Acceptance.</b>  The disposal of Specially Controlled Waste at Mont Cuet Landfill Site is limited to wastes defined in the Waste Management Licence for the site.</p> <p><b>Other guidance.</b>  Specially Controlled Waste is subject to procedures relating to notification to the Director of Environmental Health and Pollution Regulation (the Director) at the OEHPR of the presence of the waste on premises and consent for the transport</p>

<b>1.3.1 Specially Controlled Waste (Bonded Asbestos only)</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b></p> <p><b>i). Bonded Asbestos.</b>  <b>Conditions of Acceptance.</b>            Delivery to site before 15:30 (weekdays) or 09:30 (Saturdays). Disposal only in designated areas of Mont Cuet Landfill Site. Loads must be source segregated and not mixed with other waste materials. Mixed loads containing Bonded Asbestos are charged at the Contamination Rate.</p> <p><b>Excludes fire damaged bonded asbestos which requires the same controls as Fibrous Asbestos and shall be disposed of in the same manner as Fibrous Asbestos (see below).</b></p>	Bonded Asbestos Waste Rate. 2018: £222.42/t, subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.
<b>1.3.2 Specially Controlled Waste (All others Accepted for Co-Disposal)</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b></p> <p><b>i). Fibrous Asbestos and Fire Damaged Bonded Asbestos.</b></p> <p><b>Conditions of Acceptance</b>            Disposal by a specialist contractor only, with pre-notification and waste transfer documentation required in accordance with waste legislation. Air monitoring is carried out during disposal operations by the contractor. The date and time of disposal must be pre-arranged to enable a disposal cell to be prepared and other site activities to be suspended during disposal operations.</p> <p><b>ii). Chemicals.</b></p> <p><b>Conditions of Acceptance</b>            Disposals of acceptable chemicals can only be carried out by the Guernsey Health &amp; Safety Executive, and are deposited into prepared pits, with treatment applied as required.</p> <p><b>Other Guidance</b>            Specific chemicals cannot be disposed of at Mont Cuet, in accordance with the site's Waste Management Licence (see Appendix 5). Disposal of these chemicals is managed by the Guernsey Health and Safety Executive.</p>	Specially Controlled Waste Rate. 2018: £444.26/t, subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.

	<p><b>Exemptions: Small quantities of publicly available chemicals for domestic use, e.g. pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, paints/thinners, solvents, and cleaning products – if in doubt, waste holders/producers should consult with the Guernsey Health and Safety Executive.</b></p> <p><b>iii). Chemically contaminated spoil.</b> This is spoil contaminated by a dangerous substance as defined in Schedule 1 to the Waste Control and Disposal (Specially Controlled Waste) Regulations, 2010.</p> <p><b>Conditions of Acceptance</b> Materials shall be tested prior to disposal to assess the concentration of contaminants present, and requires the prior approval of the Office of Environmental Health and Pollution Regulation.</p> <p><b>Other Guidance</b> This typically covers spoil contaminated by hydrocarbons. Spoil with high levels of contamination may require remediation prior to disposal.</p>	
<p><b>1.4 Green Waste</b></p>	<p><b>What is included?</b> <b>Compostable garden, park, and horticultural waste, including grass cuttings, hedge trimmings, branches and tree stumps.</b></p> <p><b>Green waste loads containing general waste or materials that render it non-compostable will be charged at the Standard Rate, and green waste mixed with waste containing quantities of contaminants that could reasonably be segregated or recycled will be charged at the Contamination Rate.</b></p> <p><b>Other guidance</b> Noxious weeds and invasive species such as Japanese Knotweed (including root structure in soil), animal manure/bedding, bamboo, pampas grass, and specified fruit (i.e. tomatoes, peppers, etc.) will be charged at the Green Waste rate, but will be diverted to the tipping face. <i>(Route for private householder users only: Chouet Horticultural Site (excluding noxious weeds, animal bedding, and food waste)).</i></p>	<p>Commercial Green Waste Rate at Mont Cuet. 2018: £38.36, subject to a minimum charge of £5 per weighed load.</p>

<b>1.5 Mixed Household Waste – Private Householder Deliveries</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Small amounts of ‘Black Bag’ and bulky waste delivered by private householders to the Mont Cuet Civic Amenity Facility (General Waste).</b></p> <p>The charge is based on a standard bin sack (of 100 litres capacity), and non-bagged and oversize bagged waste is charged at a rate based on the volume equivalent to an 100 litre standard bin sack, up to a maximum of ten bin sacks. A guide list of standard charges, based on this formula, for specific items is provided as Appendix 6. Specific charges, however, will depend on the volume or particular loads.</p> <p><b>Larger volumes of household waste (in excess of 10 bin sacks or equivalent) shall be weighed over the weighbridge and directed to the tipping face (where appropriate), and charged at the appropriate rate for the waste category.</b></p>	<p>Private Householder Waste Rate.  2018: £2.50/bag (or equivalent receptacle/volume).</p>
<b>1.6 Incinerator Ash</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Bottom ash from the incineration of waste materials.</b></p> <p>Bottom Ash from either the PEH Clinical Incinerator or the Cattle Incinerator at Longue Hogue.</p> <p><b>Excludes Fly Ash/Air Pollution Control residues, which are classified as a Specially Controlled Waste.</b></p>	<p>Standard Rate for Mont Cuet Landfill Site.  2018: £222.42/t, subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.</p>
<b>1.7 Waste arising from street and gully cleaning, and pumping station wet-well and grit tank cleansing</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Road sweepings, gully sludges and other waste arising from street cleaning activities, and pumping station wet-well and sewage emptying point grit tank cleansing.</b></p> <p><b>Excludes Belle Greve Pumping Station Grit, which is pre-washed and disposed of as Inert Waste.</b></p>	<p>Commercial Green Waste Rate at Mont Cuet.  2018: £38.36, subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.</p>
<b>1.8 Pumping Station Screenings</b>	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Waste water treatment screenings.</b></p> <p>This includes screenings from Belle Greve Pumping Station</p>	<p>Standard Rate for Mont Cuet Landfill Site.  2018: £222.42/t subject to a minimum charge of £10 per weighed load.</p>

<b>1.12 Reload Cover Material</b>	<p><b>What is the charge for?</b></p> <p><b>The reloading of a load that does not meet the required specification for cover material (see Appendix 7 – Glossary).</b></p>	<p>Reload Charge Rate:</p> <p>2018: £80.38 per reload.</p>

<p><b>2.1 Household Waste or Commercial Waste, or a mixture of such waste, which is Inert Waste, excluding specific categories below.</b></p>	<p><b>What is included?</b>  <b>Household Waste or Commercial Waste, or a mixture of such waste, which is Inert Waste, as defined in the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2016.</b></p> <p>Inert Waste is defined in the Glossary (Appendix 7) and includes waste which does not undergo any significant physical, chemical or biological transformation following disposal.</p> <p>Inert wastes normally include soil, stone, hardcore, gravel, sand, non-recyclable glass, concrete and ceramics.</p> <p><b>Condition of Acceptance.</b>            Inert wastes must be substantially free of non-inert items/materials, and soil must be substantially free of vegetation.</p> <p>Inert wastes containing asbestos may be classified as 'Non-hazardous Asbestos Waste Containing Material' provided the asbestos content of the waste is &lt;0.1%. This is accepted at Longue Hougue Reclamation Site, accompanied by a Certificate of Analysis from testing conducted by the Guernsey Health and Safety Executive (HSE), and approved by the OEHPR.</p>	<p>Standard Rate for Longue Hougue Land Reclamation Site.            2018: £18.19/t, subject to a minimum charge of £5 per weighed load.</p>

**APPENDIX 1                    SUMMARY OF WASTE DISPOSAL SITES & CHARGES, 2018**

**SITES RESERVED FOR DISPOSAL OR RECOVERY OF PARTICULAR TYPES OF WASTE:**

**1. Mont Cuet Landfill Site. Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:00 – 16:00, Sat: 07:00 – 10:00**

Household and Commercial waste, or a mixture of such wastes, including wastes with no alternative disposal or recycling route, e.g. litter. Commercial green waste for composting. Some Specially Controlled Wastes including asbestos, contaminated spoil and chemicals may be disposed of at Mont Cuet. Specific arrangements are required for their disposal.

In order to preserve void space at Mont Cuet Landfill Site and encourage recycling, certain items/materials should not be included in loads delivered to Mont Cuet Landfill Site. Loads containing these items/materials are classified as ‘Contaminated’, with a higher charge applied. For further information please refer to the “Conditions for Acceptance” document (see below). No loads will be reloaded after tipping at Mont Cuet.

**2. Longue Hougue Reclamation Site: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 07:30 – 16:45, Sat: 07:00 – 10:00**

Inert Waste, substantially free of vegetation (<1%). Top soil with turf/vegetation is also accepted for stockpiling and processing.

**3. Fontaine Vinery Waste Segregation Facility: Opening hours Mon – Fri: 09:00 – 15:00,**

Mixed loads of commercial waste, household waste or a mixture of the same not containing putrescible or Specially Controlled Waste. Segregated commercial loads of recyclables (Glass, Tins/Cans, and Plastic Bottles, NOT cardboard and paper) and excluding Parish recyclables. Such waste delivered by or on behalf of Parishes may include paper and cardboard. Cash is NOT accepted at this site. Commercial customers only.

**4. States Works, La Hure Mare: Opening hours Mon – Thu: 07:00 – 16:00, Fri: 07:00 – 13:00**

Commercial deliveries of Expanded Polystyrene (EPS), clean and dry. A ticket must first be obtained from one of the States Waste weighbridges. EPS food and drink containers and packaging peanuts are not accepted.

### **APPENDIX 3                    GENERAL PRINCIPLES FOR APPLYING CONTAMINATION CHARGES AT MONT CUET LANDFILL SITE:**

The principle behind the charging of contaminated loads is to reduce the volume of waste delivered to Mont Cuet, thereby diverting waste from landfill to more appropriate recycling or land reclamation alternatives.

A Contaminated Load is a mixed waste load that contains Specially Controlled Waste, inert waste and/or items or materials that have an alternative recycling or disposal route.

The 'Contamination Rate' is applied to mixed waste loads which contain quantities of contaminants (as defined in the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2017) that can reasonably be segregated or recycled.

Each load received at Mont Cuet Landfill Site is assessed by the landfill site operator. A load is classified as contaminated if the amount of the specified items or materials within the mixed load is sufficient to render the load contaminated in accordance with the legislation.

The load shall be classed as contaminated if it is clear that the specified items/materials could reasonably have been separated from the other waste and diverted to alternative recycling or disposal routes.

Where a contaminated load is identified on the weighbridge the waste carrier shall be offered the opportunity by the weighbridge operator to leave the site and deliver the waste to the most appropriate waste or recycling facility.

Minor amounts of cardboard, plastic, paper, etc. would not render a load as contaminated. Similarly, materials that ordinarily could be recycled but are contaminated by food wastes or other 'contaminants', rendering them un-recyclable, would not be classed as contaminated; however the disposal of loads of cardboard, paper or clear plastic film contaminated or spoiled prior to, or during collection, will only be accepted by prior approval of the Waste Disposal Authority.

The decision to classify a load as contaminated, in accordance with the legislation, is made by the landfill operators, who are trained to identify such loads. Loads classified as contaminated shall be photographed with the date and time indicated on the photograph. Where practical the photograph should include the vehicle depositing the contaminated load. The reason for the contamination charge should be entered in the comments box on the weighbridge ticket.

Objections against a contaminated load charge should be directed in writing to the Waste Disposal Authority.

## APPENDIX 7 GLOSSARY OF TERMS USED IN THIS DOCUMENT

Please note some of these terms below are defined in the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2016. Whilst this glossary is intended to be consistent with those definitions, the definitions in the Regulations are authoritative.

Bags	Disposable bags used for the disposal of mixed waste from household or commercial sources. The standard size of a bag is 90 – 110 litres.
'Black Bag' Waste	Non-hazardous general mixed waste typically produced in a household or commercial office environment, often referred to as municipal waste (European Waste Catalogue Code: 20-03-01).
Bulky Waste	<p>Non-hazardous general waste items that are too large for disposal via normal Parish collections.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• any article of waste which exceeds 25 kilograms in weight; and/or</li> <li>• any article of waste which does not fit, or cannot be fitted into a standard waste disposal bag.</li> </ul> <p>Examples include furniture, bicycles, large appliances ('white goods), garden furniture, and portable household items. (European Waste Catalogue Code: 20-03-07)</p>
Co-Disposal	The engineered disposal of non-hazardous and certain hazardous wastes within the same site.
Commercial Waste	Commercial Waste means "waste arising from any activity carried on by way of business, and includes agricultural and horticultural waste, other than such waste arising from use of the curtilage of a dwelling house for purposes connected with the use of that dwelling house". For the purposes of this document and the Waste Disposal and Recovery Charges Regulations, 2016 this is extended to include waste arising from any activity carried on by Committees of the States, Douzaines, and Non-Profit Organisations.
Contamination Rate	The charge rate per net tonnage of mixed waste applied to loads delivered for disposal at Mont Cuet Landfill Site, where the waste contains such quantities of Specially Controlled Waste, inert waste or materials/items that can be reasonably segregated or recycled (i.e. have a reasonable alternative recycling or disposal route).
Contaminant	Any Specially Controlled Waste in a mixed load of waste for disposal at Mont Cuet Landfill Site, inert waste or items or materials included in a mixed load of waste for disposal at Mont Cuet Landfill Site present in such quantities that can reasonably be segregated or

	recycled (i.e. have a reasonable alternative recycling or disposal route).
Cover Material	Material used for covering waste at Mont Cuet Landfill Site, as required by the Waste Management Licence for the site. Specification: Clean fine inert material (e.g. soil) that is substantially free of stone and odour free. Any stone in the cover material shall be <40mm. Blended Cover is Cover Material mixed with waste wood shredded to a maximum of 25mm, at a volume ratio of 6 parts inert material/soil, 1 part shredded wood.
Frag Waste	Frag Waste, or Fragmentiser Waste, is the waste product resulting from the processing of End-of-Life Vehicles and other metal products for recycling, following the extraction of recyclable metals, also referred to as Shredder Residues. (European Waste Catalogue Code: 16-01-99)
Green Waste	Biodegradable waste composed of garden or park waste from household and commercial sources (including agricultural and horticultural wastes) such as grass cuttings, hedge trimmings, etc. Green Waste also includes large biodegradable wastes that are suitable for composting after being shredded, e.g. tree branches, trucks and stumps. (European Waste Catalogue Code: 20-02-01)
Household Waste	means waste arising from the normal use of a dwelling house as such and does not include commercial waste arising thereon.
Inert Waste	means waste: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) which does not undergo any significant physical, chemical or biological transformations,</li> <li>(b) which does not dissolve, burn or otherwise physically or chemically react, biodegrade or adversely affect other matter with which it comes into contact in a way likely to give rise to environmental pollution, and</li> <li>(c) which has insignificant total leachability and pollutant content and the leachate of which has insignificant ecotoxicity (in particular, not such as to endanger the quality of any water),</li> </ul>
Net Tonnage	Charges are applied to weighed loads based on the 'net tonnage' of the load. This is calculated to exclude the weight of the vehicle and/or receptacle holding the waste at the time of delivery, based on pre-recorded vehicle tare weights, or re-weighing vehicles after waste has been deposited as they exit the site where the load has been deposited.

Non-Hazardous Asbestos (NHA)	Non-Hazardous Asbestos Containing Material (NHACM) is Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) containing <0.1% Asbestos.
Specially Controlled Waste	Specially Controlled Waste means any description of waste identified by Ordinance under section 37 of the Environmental Pollution (Guernsey) Law, 2004 as so dangerous or difficult to dispose of that special measures need to be taken in respect of it (See section 26 of the Environmental Pollution (Waste Control and Disposal) Ordinance, 2010 and the Waste Control and Disposal (Specially Controlled Waste) Regulations, 2010.

Top Soil	The upper layer of soil containing the higher concentrations of organic matter and microorganisms where plant root structures are found.
Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE)	'Waste electrical and electronic equipment' or 'WEEE' means waste electrical or electronic equipment including all components, sub-assemblies and consumables which are part of the equipment at the time of discarding, falling within Annex 1 to the WEEE Directive 2012/19/EU
