The Future Structure of Secondary and Post-16 Education in the Bailiwick

- (a) To delete Propositions 1, 4, 7, 10 b., 11 b. and 13;
- (b) to delete proposition 8 and to substitute the following Proposition:
 - "8. To direct the Committee for Education, Sport & Culture
 - a. to form a working party including representatives from the College of Further Education, the GTA University Centre, the 6th Form Centre, the Institute of Health and Social Care Studies plus the Guernsey University Working Party which is mandated to codesign the future structure and governance of Post-16 education, and
 - b. to return to the States by March 2019 with a policy letter setting out proposals for restructuring post-16 education provision having taken into account the report of the working party.";
- (c) in Proposition 9 for the words "Site and to develop a plan for that site, which includes any synergies identified in Proposition 8, and for that plan", substitute "and Les Verandes sites and to develop plans for those sites and for those plans"; and
- (d) in Proposition 10 for "£74m", substitute "52.6M".

Explanatory Note

This amendment focusses the debate on the provision of Secondary education and instructs the Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture to form a working party including all of the principal Post-16 education providers to co-design the restructuring and governance of that provision. It also directs the Committee to return to the States with a policy letter by March 2019 setting out proposals for restructuring post-16 education provision, having taken into account the report of the working party.

This amendment also significantly reduces the total proposed capital cost down from an estimated £110m to £69.6m. The Education Estate Development Phase 1, within the current capital prioritisation cycle (2017-2020), is reduced from an estimated cost of £74m to £52.6m. The capital commitment to the Education Estate Development Phase 2 (pipeline) and bids made during the next capital prioritisation cycle (2021 onwards) is also reduced from an estimated cost of £36m-£40m to £17m.
