# Our Recommendations

- Inclusive Sixth Form College
- Further & Higher Education Institute with plans to create a Guernsey University College
- Three all-ability 11-16 secondary schools
- Greater flexibility of school placement for those with SEN
- Governance and accountability

# Education has got it right!

- Children and young people at its heart
- Evidence-based
- Detailed
- Provide certainty
- Smooth transition
- Ready to go
- Value for money

# So what's the alternative?

- One 11-18 school on two sites, CFE remains unchanged
- No information on which existing schools will be closed and which will need to be extended/doubled in size
- No information on when and how this will happen
- No detailed information on how much this will cost

## Alternative Model Comments on CfESC proposals

- Schools of vastly different size
- School size not supported by evidence
- No 11-18 in States sector
- Denies teachers chance to work across key stages
- Divides vocational and technical and partitions CFE

## Advantages of CfESC proposals

- ✓ All provide access to same curriculum/learning
- ✓ We disagree – schools are right size for Guernsey
- ✓ Best option now and flexibility for the future
- ✓ Different career opportunities and no compulsory redundancies
- ✓ Brings together all FT and PT – gives equal importance to vocational and academic pathways

## Alternative Model Comments on CfESC proposals

- Deny lecturers chance to practice across all phases of discipline
- ‘Unorthodox experiment’
- No commitment to devolve governance and leadership
- No commitment to replace outdated Education Law

## Advantages of CfESC proposals

- ✓ Opportunity to expand into new areas
- ✓ Common structure elsewhere but set in Guernsey context to deliver best for all our children and young people
- ✓ There is commitment – once structure is decided and will be co-designed by those ‘at the sharp end’
- ✓ Yes – but not a priority
