### Salerie Corner CCTV

---

**Request:**

- How many traffic incidents at Salerie junction have been reported to police since the new layout was introduced? When did these happen and what was their nature? Was the CCTV used in reviewing these? How many times was CCTV used?
- How many incidents have been spotted by staff monitoring the CCTV? When did these happen? What was their nature?
- What action has resulted from any of these incidents?
- What evidence is there that the CCTV is necessary?

**Response:**

Two incidents that directly involve the junction have been reported, both of which happened in December 2016.

One incident involved a driver who was confused by the new layout and drove along the cycle path after exiting the junction. The driver was given words of advice and no further action was taken. The second involved a cyclist who, riding along the cycle path towards the junction saw a car start to manoeuvre and thinking that they might be hit, applied their brakes very hard and fell from their bicycle as they had shoes attached to their pedals. There was no collision. CCTV cameras were reviewed, words of advice were given to the driver and no further action was taken.

The CCTV cameras at Salerie Corner feed into the JESCC control room and therefore, are not routinely monitored. The purpose of the CCTV is to capture any evidence post incident.
