Question 1

Is the President and Committee confident that post-Brexit - especially a 'No Deal' Brexit for the end of October - that the Population Management Office policies and regime are sufficiently prepared to answer questions, reassure people and employers and cope with a possible additional workload?

Question 2

It has been widely reported that a popular and respected valued rural located care home is to close quite soon for the announced reasons that the resignation of a care manager and general difficulties in recruiting suitable qualified and sufficient staff. How can Home Affairs ensure staff shortages don't lead to further closures?

Question 3

The current policy of not granting longer-term residency employment permits for carers and domestics and catering staff in the care sector apparently does not aid recruitment. Will this policy be reviewed and revised at least on a short term basis?

Question 4

A very large number of catering, restaurant, hotel and hospitality job roles from table-waiting positions to more junior chef roles are ineligible for longer-term licenses apparently. Is the committee aware of the severe staff shortages and trading concerns of the sector which are being linked to the population policies and implemented outcomes?
