## BRITISH NATIONALITY ACT 1981

### NOTICE TO PERSONS APPLYING FOR BRITISH CITIZENSHIP IN THE BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY

(This should be read in addition to the Guide for Applicants)

You must ensure that you understand and satisfy the legal requirements to qualify for naturalisation or registration as a British citizen. These requirements are explained in the guidance notes that accompany the application form. **Fees are not fully refundable for applications that fail.**


Under the nationality laws of some countries a person will automatically lose his or her nationality if he or she becomes a citizen of another country. If you have any questions about this, you should ask the authorities of the country of which you are a citizen before making your application for British citizenship.

#### **Biometrics**

All applicants, including children, are required to submit biometrics as part of the application process. Once you have submitted an application, you will receive a letter inviting you to attend this office in order for biometrics to be submitted. A child under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult at the biometric appointment, usually the parent or legal guardian. Please contact this office to make an appointment for this to be arranged. When attending, you will need to bring the letter with you along with your/the child's passport.

This will include if I/the child is arrested or charged with an offence after the application is made.

I authorise Immigration & Nationality, Guernsey Border Agency to conduct relevant checks against records held by other Government Departments, the Security Service, the Police and other agencies, where it is necessary for the purposes of considering and processing this application for British citizenship.

I agree that the relevant organisation may disclose personal information obtained as part of their statutory function.

I understand that any information provided to the above organisations in connection with this application may be used by them for the purpose of their statutory functions.
