

COMMITTEE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE 2019/01

This document has effect as an import permit for the purposes of paragraphs 6 and 7 of Schedule 7 to the Import (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 2010.

The States of Guernsey Committee for the Environment and Infrastructure authorises the importation of the following, subject to any specified conditions:

Live Animals

- 1.0 The animals specified below may be imported into Guernsey:
 - 1.1 A cat on condition that it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014,
 - 1.2 A dog, other than a breed of dog specified in Annex 1, on condition that it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014; and if it is imported from a country or territory other than a country or territory in the British Isles or directly from Malta or Finland, it is treated against mature and immature intestinal forms of the *Echinococcus multilocularis* parasite within a period of not more than 120 hours and not less than 24 hours before the time of entry into the Islands and that such **treatment**:
 - (a) is administered by a veterinarian and consists of a medicinal product that contains an appropriate dose of:
 - (i) praziquantel; or
 - (ii) pharmacologically active substances, which alone or in combination, have been proven to reduce the burden of mature and immature intestinal forms of the *Echinococcus multilocularis* parasite in the host species concerned;
 - (b) the said medicinal product has been granted:
 - (i) a marketing authorisation for use in a Member State of the European Community; or
 - (ii) an approval or licence by the competent authority of the country or territory of provenance of such a dog; and
 - (c) is recorded by the veterinarian who administered the product in an identification document that conforms with the model passport or the model health certificate in Regulation (EU) No.577/2013.
- 1.3 a ferret, on condition that it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014,
- 1.4 a pet rabbit or a pet rodent, other than a rodent of species listed in Annex A, B, or C of Regulation (EC) No. 338/97, on condition that it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014.

- 1.5 a bovine animal imported from Alderney or Sark, on condition that it:
- a) was:
 - i) born in, and has remained continuously since birth in, the island of importation; or
 - ii) imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and is being re-exported to Guernsey,
 - b) has been tested according to a standard equivalent to the requirements of the Animal Health Ordinance, 1996,
 - c) is identified according to the requirements specified in the Identification of Bovine Animals and Bovine Record Books Order, 2003; and
 - d) the island of exportation is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.6 a horse, donkey or mule imported into the Island from the United Kingdom, Ireland, Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark, on condition that:
- a) it is transported:
 - i) directly to the Island from one of the said countries or territories, or
 - ii) in the case of a horse, donkey or mule that originates from the Isle of Man, through the United Kingdom and then directly to the Island from the United Kingdom, and
 - b) that the country or territory from which a horse, donkey or mule is dispatched, or through which is transported, is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.7 a horse imported into the Island from Ireland or France on condition that:
- a) it is a horse that complies with the requirements of the Tripartite Agreement,
 - b) prior notification of importation is provided by means of TRACES,
 - c) it is imported directly to the Island from Ireland or France, and
 - d) The country of export is not is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.8 a pig, sheep or goat imported from Alderney or Sark on condition that:
- a) it was born in, and has remained continuously since birth in, the island of importation; or
 - b) it was imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and is being re-exported to Guernsey; and

- c) the island of importation is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.9 poultry imported from Jersey, Alderney or Sark on **condition** that:
- a) they were born in, and have remained continuously since birth in the island of importation; or
 - b) they were imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and are being re-exported to Guernsey; and
 - c) the island of importation is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.10 hatching eggs of poultry imported from the United Kingdom, Jersey, Alderney or Sark on condition that they were:
- a) produced in the country or territory of importation; and
 - b) the country or territory of importation is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.11 a pigeon imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man on condition that it:
- a) it is accompanied by a certificate showing that it has been vaccinated against paramyxovirus; and
 - b) the country or territory from which it is despatched or flown is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.12 an animal specified in Part I of Annex 2, imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man,
- 1.13 a pet bird specified in Part II of Annex 2, imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man,
- 1.14 an animal of a species listed in Annex A, B, or C of Regulation (EC) No. 338/97 imported from Alderney or Sark, on condition that it was:
- a) born in, and has remained continuously since birth in, the island of importation; or
 - b) imported into the island of importation in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulation prior to consignment to Guernsey,
- 1.15 an aquatic animal, other than an animal of a species listed in Annex A, B, or C of Regulation (EC) No. 338/97, imported from a Member State of the European Community, Jersey, Alderney or Sark, by a:
- a) private individual, provided that such an animal is intended to be kept by that person in an aquarium or pond, or

- b) business, provided that such an animal is intended for sale to private individuals to be kept in an aquarium or pond.
- 1.16 an organism specified in Annex 3, imported from the United Kingdom or a Member State of the European Community for use as a biological control agent.

Bovine Semen, Ova and Embryos

- 2.0 Bovine semen, ova and embryos may be imported into Guernsey in accordance with the provisions of the Bovine Semen, Artificial Insemination and Embryo Transplantation Ordinances, 1957 to 2001.

Pet Foods

- 3.0 A pet food may be imported:
- a) from the United Kingdom or a Member States of the European Community on condition that it has been produced in accordance with Regulation 1774/2002; and
 - b) from a third country, on condition that it:
 - i) originates from a country or territory that is listed in Decision 79/542/EC,
 - ii) in the case of a pet food that contain fishery products, originates from a country that is listed in Commission Decision 97/296/EC,
 - iii) has been produced in an establishment that conforms with the requirements of Regulation 1774/2002,
 - iv) has been imported into the European Community through a Border Inspection Post and has been released from such a Post for circulation within the Community before being consigned to Guernsey; and
 - v) is accompanied by the certification specified in Regulation 1774/2002 and that certification includes any guarantees required by the Community regarding certain Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies.
- 3.1 Pet food specified in paragraph 4.0 imported into Jersey, Alderney or Sark before consignment to Guernsey, may be imported into Guernsey on condition that they meet the requirements of the relevant paragraph.

Fertiliser

- 4.0 A fertiliser may be imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark on condition that it conforms with the requirements of Regulation 2003/2003.
- 4.1 A fertiliser imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man, that has been imported into Jersey, Alderney or Sark before

consignment to Guernsey, may be imported into Guernsey on condition that it meets the requirements of Regulation 2003/2003.

Hay Straw and Litter

5.0 Hay, straw and litter for use as bedding may be imported from a Member State of the European Community, the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark; on condition that the country or territory from which it is imported is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions.

Interpretation

6.1 For the purposes of this licence, the following definitions shall apply, unless the context requires otherwise –

- “aquatic animal”** means fish belonging to the superclass Agnatha and the classes Chondrichthyes and Osteichthyes, mollusc belonging to the Phylum Mollusca, crustacean belonging to the Subphylum Crustacea, anemones (Family Actiniidae), Star fish and Urchins (Class Asteroidea), Sea Cucumbers (Class Holothuroidea), Sponges (Phylum Porifera), Sea Squirts (Ascidiacea) and Featherworms (Family Sabellidae).
- “biological control agent”** means an organism that is a natural predator of a pest organism.
- “bivalve mollusc”** means filter feeding lamellibranch mollusc and includes tunicates, echinoderms and marine gastropods.
- “Border Inspection Post”** means a place in a Member State of the European Community established in accordance with Directive 97/78/EC at which consignments are introduced into one of the territories listed in Annex I of that Directive.
- “bovine”** means an animal of the family Bovidae.
- “cat”** means Felis catus, excluding hybrids F1 to F4
- Commission Decision 2003/803/EC** means Commission Decision of 26 November 2003 establishing a model passport for the intra-Community movements of dogs, cats and ferrets.
- Commission Decision 2004/824/EC** means Commission Decision of 1 December 2004 establishing a model health certificate for non-commercial movements of dogs, cats and ferrets from third countries into the Community
- “Directive 97/78/EC”** means Council Directive 97/78/EC of 18 December 1997 laying down the principles governing the organisation of veterinary checks on products entering the Community from third countries
- “dog”** means Canis lupus familiaris, excluding hybrids F1 to F4.

“fertiliser”	means material, the main function of which is to provide nutrients for plants.
“fishery product”	means all seawater or freshwater animals (except for live bivalve molluscs, live echinoderms, live tunicates and live marine gastropods, and all mammals, reptiles and frogs) whether wild or farmed and including all edible forms, parts and products of such animals.
“hay”	means any grass, clover, lucerne or sainfoin which has been dried either naturally or artificially and includes any product (other than grain) which is obtained by so drying any green cereal.
“island of importation”	in relation to an animal, means – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the island from which the animal is imported into Guernsey, and (b) in the case of Jersey, means the Bailiwick of Jersey.
“litter”	includes any other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals.
“OIE”	means the World Organisation for Animal Health.
“ornamental aquatic animal”	means an aquatic animal which is kept, reared or placed on the market for ornamental purposes only.
“pet”	means an animal kept for interest or companionship.
“pet food”	means raw or processed meat derived from any animal that may be mixed with any non-meat products that may be placed on the market in cans or other hermetically sealed containers that is intended to be fed to any animal belonging to species normally nourished and kept, but not consumed, by humans for purposes other than farming and includes dog chews.
“poultry”	means farmed birds, including birds that are not considered as domestic but which are farmed as domestic animals, with the exception of ratites and includes domestic fowl, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowl, quail, pheasant and partridge.
“ratite”	means an animal of the families Struthionidae, Rheidae and Cassuariidae.
“Regulation 338/97”	Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 of 9 December 1996 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein.

“Regulation 557/2013”	Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No577/2013 of 28 June 2013 on the model identification documents for the non-commercial movement of dogs, cats and ferrets, the establishment of lists of territories and third countries and the format, layout and language requirements of the declarations attesting compliance with certain conditions provided for in Regulation (EU) No576/2013 of the European Parliament and the Council.
“Regulation 1774/2002”	means Regulation (EC) No 1774/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 3 October 2002 laying down health rules concerning animal by-products not intended for human consumption.
“Regulation 2003/2003”	means Regulation (EC) No 2003/2003 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 October 2003 relating to fertilisers.
“rodent”	means any animal of the Order Rodentia and includes mice, rats, guinea pigs, chinchillas, gerbils and hamsters.
“specimen”	means includes live examples of flora and fauna and any parts and derivatives thereof.
“straw”	means and green cereal which has been dried either naturally or artificially and includes any product (other than grain) which is obtained by so drying any green cereal.
“third country”	means a country or territory other than the Channel Islands, Isle of Man, the United Kingdom or a Member State of the European Community.
“Tripartite Agreement”	means the agreement between France, Ireland and the United Kingdom concerning the movement and trade in equidae signed by the Chief Veterinary Officers of France, Ireland and the United Kingdom in Paris on 20 November 2013.

6.2 In this licence, unless the context requires otherwise –

6.3 Unless the context requires otherwise, an expression used in this import permit has the same meaning as in the Import (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 2010.

Revocation

7.1 The General Import Licence 2017/01 is revoked.

Validity

8.1 This licence is valid from the date of signature and until revoked by a subsequent licence.
