

# COMMITTEE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

## GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE 2021/01

This document has effect as an import licence for the purposes of paragraphs 6, 7 and 8 of Schedule 7 to the Import (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 2010, as amended.

This licence does not exempt a person who imports anything specified in this licence from the obligation to provide prior notification of such importation under The Official Controls (Brexit) (Amendment) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations, 2020.

The States of Guernsey Committee *for the* Environment and Infrastructure authorises the importation of the following, subject to any specified conditions:

### Live Animals

- 1.0 The animals specified below may be imported into Guernsey:
- 1.1 A pet cat accompanied by its owner or a person holding written authorisation from the owner, on condition that it is imported with no more than four other cats and it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014;
- 1.2 A pet dog accompanied by its owner or a person holding written authorisation from the owner, other than a breed or type of dog specified in Annex 1, on condition that it is imported with no more than four other dogs; and it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014; and if it is imported from a country or territory other than the United Kingdom, Crown Dependencies, Republic of Ireland, Malta, Norway or Finland, it is treated against mature and immature intestinal forms of the *Echinococcus multilocularis* parasite within a period of not more than 120 hours (5 days) and not less than 24 hours (1 day) before the time of entry into the Islands and that such treatment:
  - (a) is administered by a veterinarian and consists of a medicinal product that contains an appropriate dose of:
    - (i) praziquantel; or
    - (ii) pharmacologically active substances, which alone or in combination, have been proven to reduce the burden of mature and immature intestinal forms of the *Echinococcus multilocularis* parasite in the host species concerned;
  - (b) the said medicinal product has been granted:
    - (i) a marketing authorisation for use in Great Britain or a Member State of the European Community; or
    - (ii) an approval or licence by the competent authority of the country or territory of provenance of such a dog; and

- (c) is recorded by the veterinarian who administered the product in an identification document that conforms with the model passport or the model health certificate in Regulation (EU) No.577/2013.
- 1.3 a pet ferret accompanied by its owner or a person holding written authorisation from the owner, on condition that it is imported with no more than four other ferrets; and it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014,
- 1.4 pet mice, rats, hamsters, gerbils, guinea pigs and chinchillas accompanied by its owner or a person holding written authorisation from the owner, on condition that it is imported in accordance with the provisions of the Rabies Order, 2014.
- 1.5 a Guernsey breed or first cross breed of bovine animal imported from Alderney or Sark, on condition that it:
- a) was:
    - i) born in, and has remained continuously since birth in, the island of importation; or
    - ii) imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and is being re-exported to Guernsey,
  - b) has been tested according to a standard equivalent to the requirements of the Animal Health Ordinance, 1996,
  - c) is identified according to the requirements specified in the Identification of Bovine Animals and Bovine Record Books Order, 2003; and
  - d) the island of exportation is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.6 a horse, donkey or mule imported into the Island from Great Britain, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark, on condition that:
- a) it is transported:
    - i) directly to the Island from one of the said countries or territories, or
    - ii) in the case of a horse, donkey or mule that originates from the Isle of Man, through Great Britain and then directly to the Island from Great Britain, and
  - b) that the country or territory from which a horse, donkey or mule is dispatched, or through which is transported, is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.7 a pig, sheep or goat imported from Alderney or Sark on condition that:
- a) it was born in, and has remained continuously since birth in, the island of importation; or

- b) it was imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and is being re-exported to Guernsey; and
  - c) the island of importation is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions,
- 1.8 poultry imported from Jersey, Alderney or Sark on condition that:
- a) they were born in, and have remained continuously since birth in the island of importation; or
  - b) they were imported into the island of importation from Guernsey and are being re-exported to Guernsey; and
  - c) the island of importation is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.9 hatching eggs of poultry imported from Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney or Sark on condition that they were:
- a) produced in the country or territory of importation; and
  - b) the country or territory of importation is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.10 a pigeon imported from a Member State of the European Community or Northern Ireland, Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man on condition that it:
- a) it is accompanied by a certificate showing that it has been vaccinated against pigeon paramyxovirus type 1 (PPMV1); and
  - b) the country or territory from which it is despatched or flown is not subject to restrictions in relation to Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza,
- 1.11 an animal specified in Part I of Annex 2, imported from a Member State of the European Community or Northern Ireland, Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man,
- 1.12 a pet bird accompanied by its owner or a person holding written authorisation from the owner, specified in Part II of Annex 2, imported from a Member State of the European Community or Northern Ireland, Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or the Isle of Man,
- 1.13 An animal or animal product of a species specified in the Control of Trade in Endangered Species etc. (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Ordinance, 2016.

## **Bovine Semen, Ova and Embryos**

- 2.1 Bovine semen, ova and embryos may be imported into Guernsey in accordance with the provisions of the Bovine Semen, Artificial Insemination and Embryo Transplantation Ordinances, 1957 to 2001.

## **Fertiliser**

- 3.1 A fertilising product imported from Great Britain, a Member State of the European Union or Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark, provided that it complies with the requirements of Regulation 2019/1009.

## **Hay, Straw and Litter**

- 4.1 Hay, straw and litter for use as bedding may be imported from a Member State of the European Community or Northern Ireland, Great Britain, the Isle of Man, Jersey, Alderney or Sark; on condition that the country or territory from which it is imported is not subject to foot and mouth disease restrictions.

## **Interpretation**

- 5.1 For the purposes of this licence, the following definitions shall apply, unless the context requires otherwise –

<b>“bovine”</b>	means an animal of the family Bovidae.
<b>“cat”</b>	means <i>Felis catus</i> , excluding hybrids F1 to F4
<b>“dog”</b>	means <i>Canis lupus familiaris</i> , excluding hybrids F1 to F4.
<b>“fertilising product”</b>	means a substance, mixture, micro-organism or any other material, applied or intended to be applied on plants or their rhizosphere or on mushrooms or their mycosphere, or intended to constitute the rhizosphere or mycosphere, either on its own or mixed with another material, for the purpose of providing the plants or mushrooms with nutrient or improving their nutrition efficiency;
<b>“hay”</b>	means any grass, clover, lucerne or sainfoin which has been dried either naturally or artificially and includes any product (other than grain) which is obtained by so drying any green cereal.
<b>“island of importation”</b>	in relation to an animal, means –  (a) the island from which the animal is imported into Guernsey, and  (b) in the case of Jersey, means the Bailiwick of Jersey.

<b>“litter”</b>	includes any other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals.
<b>“pet”</b>	means an animal kept for interest or companionship.
<b>"poultry"</b>	means farmed birds, including birds that are not considered as domestic but which are farmed as domestic animals, with the exception of ratites and includes domestic fowl, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowl, quail, pheasant and partridge.
<b>“ratite”</b>	means an animal of the families Struthionidae, Rheidae and Cassuariidae.
<b>“Regulation 577/2013”</b>	means Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 577/2013 of 28 June 2013 on the model identification documents for the non-commercial movement of dogs, cats and ferrets, the establishment of lists of territories and third countries and the format, layout and language requirements of the declarations attesting compliance with certain conditions provided for in Regulation (EU) No576/2013 of the European Parliament and the Council.
<b>“Regulation 2019/1009”</b>	means Regulation (EU) 2019/1009 of 5 June 2019 laying down rules on the making available on the market of EU fertilising products.
<b>“straw”</b>	means and green cereal which has been dried either naturally or artificially and includes any product (other than grain) which is obtained by so drying any green cereal.

5.2 In this licence, unless the context requires otherwise –

- (a) a reference to any enactment or UK legislation is a reference to the enactment or legislation concerned as from time to time amended, varied, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended or applied,
- (b) a reference to any Community enactment or any provision or part of it, is a reference to the enactment provision, or part concerned as from time to time amended or re-issued (with or without modification), and
- (c) a reference to any convention, treaty or other international agreement, or any provision or part of it is a reference to the agreement, provision, or part concerned, as from time to time amended or re-issued (with or without modification).


5.3 Unless the context requires otherwise, an expression used in this import licence has the same meaning as in the Import (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 2010, as amended.
