Determining the Best Model for Secondary Education

AMENDMENT

Proposed by: Deputy N R Inder Seconded by: Deputy A H Brouard

1. For Proposition 2, substitute the following:-

"2. To direct the Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture to prepare a report on non-selective educational delivery, for the States **before the end of March 2021**, that must include a comprehensive comparison of the structure and implementation of:-

- (a) the one school on two sites plan,
- (b) a one school three college model encompassing three 11 to 18
 Colleges which shall be federated as one School and will be based at St Sampson's, Les Beaucamps and Les Varendes,
- (c) three 11-16 school models, including a separate sixth form centre;

(d) two 11-16 school models and one 11-18 school; and

to revert to the States with a Policy Letter and suitable Propositions to implement what it believes to be the best model for secondary education in Guernsey."

Rule 4(3) Information

The capital cost of the 2 school model approved by the States on 6th September, 2019 amounted approximately to £129 million. The costings for the three-school model set out in Propositions which accompanied the Policy Letter of the Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture at item III on Billet d'État No. II of 2018 ("The Future Structure of Secondary and Post-16 Education in the Bailiwick" – P.2017/110) amounted to £114 million. Allowing for a 10 % uplift on the costs set out in those Propositions would suggest an indicative current cost for a one school - three college model of approximately £125.4 million.

Explanatory note

This amendment proposes replacement of Proposition 2 on the Requête with a new proposition that would require the Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture to prepare a report and revert to the States on the structure and implementation of the plan and models for secondary education set out at (a) to (d) of the amendment. Effectively it includes in Proposition 2, the one school - three college (Le Tocq/Brouard) model, encompassing three 11 to 18 Colleges to be federated as one School and based at St Sampson's, Les Beaucamps and Les Varendes and previously considered by the States, but also includes alternative models for review.
