- 2. The annual number of people treated for Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis with biologics (such as adalumimab, infliximab, golumimab and vedoluzimab) for each of the years 2016 to 2020

In the response we have included the reason for admission as the majority of admissions where Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis is the primary diagnosis are for infusions of a therapeutic substance.
