In Proposition 13, after to approve the schemes detailed in Figure 20 as the capital portfolio for the period 2021-2025, add the following wording “with the addition of CCTV replacement as a pipeline scheme”.

**Rule 4(3) Information**

It is anticipated that the minimal cost associated with the inclusion of the CCTV Replacement as a pipeline scheme will be accommodated within the allowance for developing pipeline schemes included within the portfolio.

**Explanatory note**

The States of Guernsey has recognised that the infrastructure and hardware supporting the current deployment of CCTV and video management systems across its estate and Committee areas requires investment and development to meet current and future demands and to allow for emerging technologies to be exploited in a manner that represents an efficient and effective use of public funding.

In parallel it will be essential to create and maintain a multi-agency CCTV capability across the States of Guernsey to meet current and future demands of crime prevention & detection, to ensure enhanced community safety and enhance the security of the Bailiwick’s Critical National Infrastructure.

Following advice recently received the Committee *for* Home Affairs (the Committee) are extremely concerned that as a result of aging infrastructure and hardware the CCTV provision is at risk of failure and in some areas is not fit for purpose. The Committee identified this programme as a priority requiring capital funding. CCTV is fundamentally a tool and service that supports public safety and provides both a deterrent and surveillance. Ensuring that this programme of work is included in the pipeline projects will allow scoping to take place and inform the development of a Bailiwick CCTV Strategy.
