# Transanal Irrigation Products

After a discussion it was agreed to recommend the products requested.

#### Ranolazine

There was a lengthy discussion about the evidence to support this drug. It was noted that the outcome data trial, which reported in 2016, unfortunately did not show any statisticallysignificant benefit. The NICE Guidance on stable angina, recommends one or two of 8 other angina drugs, all of which are approved. It was further noted that ranolazine is licensed for stable angina only. Despite an extensive literature search, no data on this drug's effect on reducing rates of hospitalisations was found. The decision to decline was unanimous.

## 4. Prescribing Support Unit Annual Report 2020

GOR expressed appreciation to colleagues in the prescribing organisations for their continued work in delivering the pharmaceutical service during an extremely challenging year. Of note was the continued decline in the prescribing of antibacterials, opioids and hypnotics and analgesics. The total drug costs rose, before rebates and discounts, by 5% but this was reduced to a 1% increase by prescribing efficiencies and rebates on drugs dispensed in the community. Costs were further reduced, but by an unknown amount, by significant NHS discounts to *Cf*HSC on the cost of specialist drugs, prescribed to outpatients, sourced via the NHS supply chain and PAS agreements.

# 3. Any other business

Cost-neutral addition of oxycodone 15mg MR tablets, as opposed to 1 x 10mg MR tablet and 1x 5 mg MR tablet.
