15:01	Presiding Officer	Ruling from the Presiding Officer: States that it is possible that it should be but he is not sure that the Rules of Procedure, as such, extend to incorporate the Code of Conduct, where that is an issue. He stated it could become a Code issue, in his view, however asserted he was not saying it would be. If there were concerns about a Members' conduct within the context of this Assembly, it can still be a Code of Conduct issue. What it cannot be is a litigation issue because of the absolute privilege to which all Members are entitled. Privilege should not be abused but in terms of whether that would be capable of being litigated, he did not think it would be, in any event, but if it were, then Deputy Trott would benefit from the absolute privilege which is conferred upon on all Members for these proceedings, and other matters, under the Reform Law. Therefore not going to invite Deputy Trott to withdraw his comment. Deputy Trott approached it in a fashion that the Presiding Officer thought was just about acceptable, as Deputy Trott had recognised, by saying he had come close to the line, but the Presiding Officer did not believe he had transgressed it and therefore he would be allowed to continue without withdrawing but that did not mean to say that Members should take that ruling as carte blanche to start saying things that they would be better off not saying. This debate does not need to descend to those levels. Asked Deputy Trott to continue.
