Freedom of Information request regarding vehicle numbers and fuel duty

## Request:

Of the total number of vehicles registered in Guernsey, how many are hybrid electric i.e. which also have either a petrol or diesel engine?

Of the total number of cars registered in Guernsey, how many are pure electric i.e. having neither a petrol nor diesel engine?

Do you also have a figure for the total annual amount of fuel duty received in tax from the sale of petrol and diesel to road vehicles?

## Response provided by the Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure:

The current number of vehicles registered in Guernsey is 88,532. However, it is recognised that a number of vehicles will either be off the road or have not been formally deregistered. The estimated number in circulation is believed to be in the order of 65,400.

The total number of hybrid vehicles currently registered is: 1398 (1 of which is a light van).

The total number of pure electric vehicles registered is: 1552 (1118 cars, 268 light vans and 166 motorcycles).

The amount of duty received in 2021 from sale of motor fuel is £18.9m. Figures for motor fuels include approximately £300,000 of marine fuel duty. So total for road vehicles is approximately £18.6m.
