The evidence/documentation available is insufficient to demonstrate on the balance of probabilities that the land outlined in red on the site location and block plan, has been used for the storage of materials and vehicles and use as builder's yard, classified within Use Class 22 of The Land Planning and Development (Use Classes) Ordinance, 2017, for a continuous period of more than 10 years.
