

The site opened in 2008 and has proved extremely popular. Last year more than 62,000 vehicles visited, and around 10,000 disclaimers were signed for anything from bicycles to old flower pots that were taken away for reuse. Nearly 1000 tonnes of material was also recycled.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### Why did the site have to move?

To allow work to begin on a new slaughterhouse, next to the existing cattle incinerator. This provided an ideal opportunity to improve the layout of the site.

### Why introduce site rules?

Public Services is required to operate the site in accordance with the Environmental Pollution (Guernsey) Law, 2004. With so many visitors, rules are also required to maintain Health & Safety, ensure a positive experience for all site users, and support the aim of promoting reuse and recycling.

### Why sign a disclaimer every time I want to reuse something?

This provides a record of items reused, which helps Public Services to measure this and understand the requirements of the facility. It also makes site users aware that the States of Guernsey does not warrant that any goods taken from the site for reuse are safe, fit for purpose or in a good or usable condition. All items taken from the site are **untested** and as such the States of Guernsey does not accept liability for any damage or loss that may result from their reuse.

## Site rules

1. All visitors must report to site staff before unloading.
2. Items may only be removed from zones 3 & 4, and for safety reasons must not be broken up.
3. Members of the public are not permitted in zone 2.
4. Site users **MUST** sign a disclaimer form before removing any item(s) from the site.
5. Only those items included on the list of acceptable items (overleaf) can be deposited on the site.
6. No items may be deposited on or outside of the site other than during the opening hours.
7. Children must be under adult supervision at all times, and pets are not permitted (except guide dogs).
8. No smoking, eating, drinking, or lighting of fires is permitted on the site.
9. We advise the use of suitable footwear and gloves when using the site.
10. Site users not complying with these rules and the Code of Conduct may be asked to leave the site.
11. Unauthorised removal of any item(s) may result in a **CRIMINAL PROSECUTION** - if you are in any doubt please speak to a member of staff.

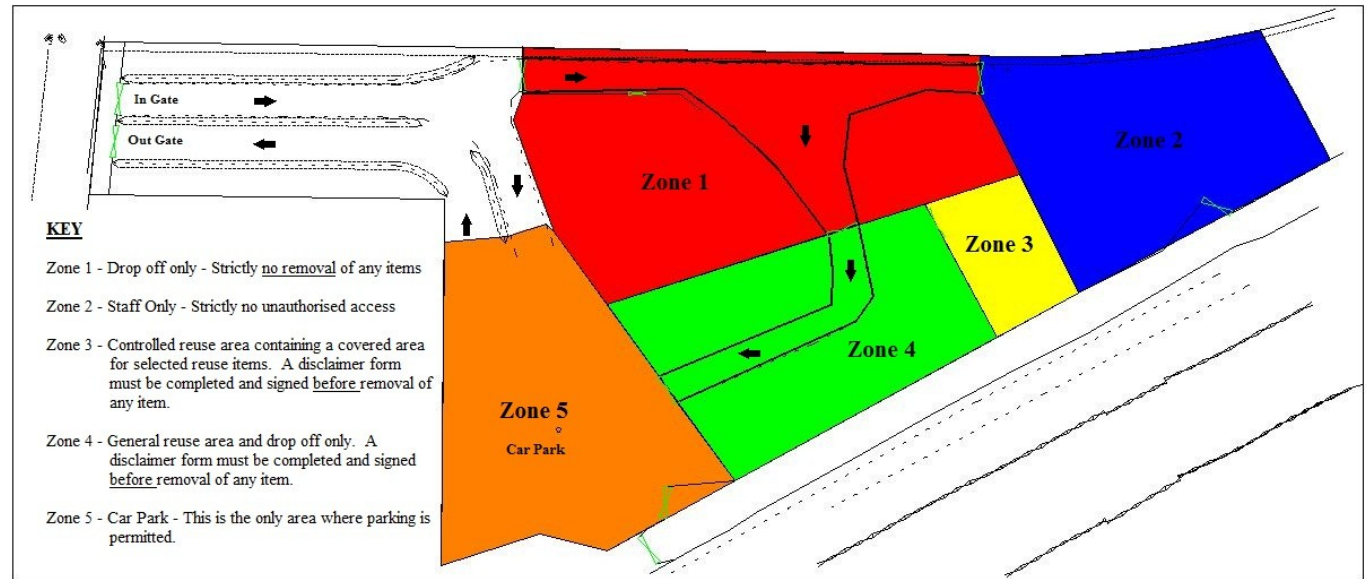
