#### 1.1 Introduction

The Labour Market Bulletin provides a quarterly snapshot of the Guernsey labour market using claimant and contribution data provided by the States of Guernsey Social Security Department.

#### 1.2 Headlines


- In June 2012, 32,467 people were employed or self employed in Guernsey. This was 124 fewer than in June 2011, an annual decrease of 0.4%.
- 3,040 people (9.4%) were self-employed and 29,427 (90.6%) were working for an employer.
- The number of people registered unemployed (using the International Labour Office (ILO) definition of unemployment) at the end of June 2012 was 357, representing 1.1% of the workforce; 0.2 percentage points more than in June 2011.
- There were 2,284 employing organisations in Guernsey in June 2012, 1.1% fewer than at the same time the previous year.
- There were 6,785 people working in the finance sector in June 2012, 1.6% less than a year previously. Employment in the finance sector represented 20.9% of total employment in June 2012.

Figure 1.3.1: Employment



Employed people are classified by the Social Security Department as those who work for wages or a salary under a contract of service. Self employed people are those who are in business for themselves, not under the control of an employer.

Total employment is calculated by adding the number of employed and self employed people.

There were 32,467 people employed or self employed in Guernsey in June 2012, 124 people or 0.4% fewer than in June 2011 (see *table 2.1.1*).

Over the 10 year period ending June 2012 total employment has increased by 2.0%.

Total employment in Guernsey shows seasonal variations as certain sectors (e.g hostelry and horticulture) employ more people during the summer than in the winter. As a result of this, total employment in Guernsey is typically higher in the second and third quarters (ending September and December) than in the first and fourth quarters (ending March and December).

The seasonally adjusted trend shown graphically in *figure 1.3.1* estimates the underlying movement in the data by removing seasonal and irregular movements. The trend is calculated using the Census X-12 method, which was developed by the US Census Bureau.

The number of employees (i.e. working for an employer) is subject to the seasonal variations described on the previous page. The number of self employed people does not show regular seasonal increases and decreases to the same extent as the number of employees.

The number of employees in Guernsey in June 2012 decreased by 0.4% to 29,427. The number of self employed people decreased by 0.5% to 3,040 (see *table 3.1.1* and *figure 3.1.1*).





Figure 3.1.2: Annual percentage change in employment by gender

Women comprised 46.2% of the total number of people in employment in June 2012. The number of women in employment (14,988) was 6 higher than in June 2011. (see *table 3.1.1* and *figure 3.1.2*).

The number of men in employment decreased by 0.7% to 17,479 in the year ending June 2012.

Figure 3.1.1: Annual percentage change in employees and self employed

Employers and employees can be analysed by economic sector for a more detailed picture of the types of economic activity in which they are involved. A breakdown of the activities included in each of the economic sector codes used in this bulletin can be found on our website **www.gov.gg/ecodes**.

As show in *figure 3.2.1* and *table 3.2.1*, the finance sector was the largest employer in June 2012, employing 6,785 people. Total employment in this sector decreased by 1.6% (107 people) between June 2011 and June 2012.

Real estate activities showed the largest percentage increase in employment in the year ending June 2012, increasing by 12% and employing an additional 26 people (see *table 3.2.1* and *figure 3.2.2*).


The construction sector had the largest number of self employed people in June 2012, with 857 people representing 28.2% of all self employed people and 27.3% of total employment in the sector. Other service activities had the highest rate of self employment with 31.1% of those working in the sector classified as self employed.



# 4.1 Employers by size

Figure 4.1.1: Total employers



In June 2012 there were 2,284 employers in Guernsey 26 fewer than a year previously. There were 43 organisation employing more than 100 people in June 2012, 2 fewer than in June the previous year (see *figure 4.1.1* and *table 4.1.1*).

The Finance sector had the most organisations employing more than 50 people (see *table 4.2.1*). The construction sector has the most organisations employing five people or fewer.

Please note that some of the percentage changes are based on small numbers and can therefore seem large relative to the actual change in numbers.



Figure 5.1.1: Percentage of workforce registered as unemployed





Figure 5.1.2: Composition of total registered



Unemployment in Guernsey shows a degree of seasonal variation and is typically highest in the first quarter of each year.

As show in *table 5.1.1*, there were 357 people registered as unemployed using the International Labour Office definitions of unemployment<sup>1</sup> in June 2012, 76 people more than in June the previous year.

The registered unemployment rate using the ILO definition was 1.1% at the end of June 2012, 0.2 percentage points higher than in June 2011 (see *figure 5.1.1*).

The "total registered unemployed" measure (which was the previous headline measure) includes those on government training schemes for the unemployed (such as the Community and Environmental Projects Scheme) or anybody in part time or casual employment who is available to work additional hours and still eligible to claim job seekers benefit to supplement their income.

The rate of unemployment using the total registered unemployed measure was 1.7% at the end of June 2012, 0.3 percentage points higher than in June 2011.

Figure 5.1.2 shows the composition of total registered unemployment (i.e ILO unemployment plus claimants in part-time or casual employment or participating in a training scheme but still eligible for jobseekers benefits).

At the end of June 2012 there were 162 claimants participating in part time or casual work, 17 more than in June 2012. There were also 33 claimants participating in government training schemes in June 2012, two fewer than at the same time the previous year.

### 5.2 Unemployment in detail

The number of men unemployed (by ILO definitions) in June 2012 was greater than the number of women registered unemployed in all age categories (see *figure 5.2.1*). Of the those registered unemployed using the ILO definitions, 33% were women; 3 percentage points less than at the same time the previous year

Typically, the age distribution of registered unemployment among women is more even than among men. The higher level of unemployment in the younger age categories in particular is more pronounced in men then in women.

The age group with the highest number of registered unemployed men was the 20-29 category accounting for 30% of unemployed men and 20% of the total number of unemployed people (by ILO definitions).

The age group with the most unemployed women in June 2012 was also 20-29, in which there were 31 women who were registered as unemployed using the ILO definition.

Of the registered unemployed who called into SSD in the snapshot week at the end of June 2012, 46% had been registered unemployed for less than three months at that time . 15% of claimants had been registered unemployed for more than a year (see *table 5.2.1* and *figure 5.2.2*).

Figure 5.2.1: Unemployment by age and gender in June 2012




Figure 5.2.3: Number of vacancies placed with the job centre each month


