- 1. The figures above relate to planning applications and appeals made under the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('The 2005 Law').
- 2. Speed of decision is measured in terms of the period between receipt of the valid application and the actual issue (i.e. posting out) of the formal decision notice (not the time between receipt of the application and the making of the decision, which will be slightly shorter).
- 3. A new statistic is included this quarter relating to speed of decision on 'householder' applications. These are generally more minor applications for domestic development. The target relates to the recommendation of the Shepley Report into the Planning Service (2008) that the Department takes a structured approach to monitoring the flexibility and 'attention to detail' applied to minor applications.

4.	The "appeal result" statistic measures the proportion of dismissed appeals relative to all appeal decisions on planning applications (including any appeals conceded) over the report period. Dismissed appeals are those decided in favour of the Department.
