**Report on the Bailiwick of Guernsey**



# Foreword

The Census of **the Bailiwick of Guernsey** was taken on the night of the **25th/26th April, 1971**, simultaneously with that of England and Wales and was conducted by the States of Guernsey Board of Administration, in the case of Guernsey, Sark, Herm and Jethou under the powers conferred by The Census Ordinance, 1971 and in the case of Alderney, by The Census (Alderney) Ordinance, 1971.

The tabulation and analysis of the returns has been carried out by the Census Office of the States of Guernsey Board of Administration in collaboration with the data processing Department of the States of Guernsey Electricity Board.

The statistics and tabulations in respect of the 1971 Census were programmed for and compiled by an ICL 1901a Computer with a 16K core store and CCF unit; 2 x 20K/C magnetic tape decks and 2 x 8 million character Exchangeable Disc Units. All input to the system was by document reader, on documents prepared by the enumerators and Census office staff from the Census forms, see page 17 for computer input documents.

This computer was the first computer to be installed in the Channel Islands and the production of the Census data was achieved for the first time by an all Guernsey team.

Both Boards desire to acknowledge the great assistance given to them by the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys, Titchfield, Hampshire.

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# General Explanatory Notes

## Census Population

The 1971 Census statistics are in respect of the living population enumerated as at midnight, 25th/26th April, 1971. As on previous occasions, the census population which forms the basis of the statistics relating to each area of the Bailiwick of Guernsey is the de facto population, whether of British or non-British nationality, actually enumerated within the Bailiwick on census night. It comprises visitors from abroad (including Armed Forces of Commonwealth or foreign countries except those on board foreign naval vessels) or from the United Kingdom, as well as those residents who were at home, but not people usually resident in the Bailiwick who were absent on census night. It includes the crews and passengers of ships, boats and barges allocated with as much accuracy as the census record allows, according to the position of their anchorage or mooring at census midnight or, if they were then on a coastal or fishing voyage, to their next port or place of call. Persons travelling during the night or otherwise inaccessible were counted as part of the population of that part of the Bailiwick at which they arrived on the following day, unless they had been previously enumerated.

The population thus recorded excludes in particular members of the Armed Forces and Mercantile Marine outside the Islands and in this respect omits a number of persons who might otherwise have been in the Bailiwick.

## 1961 and earlier census figures

No changes of boundary have been made since 1961; figures in respect of earlier censuses relate to local areas as constituted at the date of the 1971 Census.

## Islands and Civil Parishes

Figures for the Bailiwick relate to Guernsey, Herm, Jethou, Lihou, Alderney, Sark and Brechou. Those for Guernsey include Herm, Jethou and Lihou, whilst those for Sark include Brechou.

## Names

The spelling of place names follows generally that adopted by the Ordnance Survey Department.

## Acreage

The figures relate to land and inland water together, exclusive of tidal water and foreshore. The figures for Alderney are reprinted from the Census Report for 1861, no later information being available. Other acreages are based on Ordnance Survey computations, those for the Island of Guernsey are derived from the resurvey of 1938 and the remainder from the resurvey of 1899.

## Schedule

A copy of the Schedule used in the Bailiwick is reprinted in reduced format on pages 10 to 14.

## Presentation Conventions

A O indicates that the quantity is zero or that a particular combination of line and column is impossible.

## Building

The different types of building were referred to in the enumerators' instruction books as follows:-

**"Private residential accommodation**, e.g. houses, bungalows, flats. **Communal establishments**, e.g. hotels, hospitals. **Partly residential**, e.g. shop with rooms over, caretakers flat in office block. **Non-residential**, e.g. factories, warehouses, lock-up shops. **Non-permanent buildings**, e.g. houseboats."

Caravans, houseboats, barges, boats and other similar mobile structures were treated as buildings only if they were occupied on Census night or were some person's usual residence. Other mobile structures were not included in the tables.

Huts, shacks, tents and similar non-permanent structures were treated as buildings if they were occupied on Census night, or were some person's usual residence. Otherwise they were ignored.



## **Dwelling**

The definition of a "structurally separate dwelling" in the enumerators' instruction book was given as:-

"A building containing residential accommodation with direct access from outside. For example a block of flats with a common entrance from outside is regarded as one dwelling. In the case where a dwelling house has been constructed as or converted into, say, two flats, each of which has direct access from outside (i.e. no common entrance) count each flat as a structurally separate dwelling".

Chalets which were not associated with hotels, guest houses and other similar communal establishments were regarded as structurally separate dwellings but were described as "chalets" in the record.

Dwellings have been classified as PERMANENT and NON-PERMANENT dwellings. A non-permanent dwelling is a dwelling in a mobile or non-permanent structure of the type not counted as a building unless it was some person's usual residence on Census night. All other dwellings have been classified as permanent. The definition of a PERMANENT building in the enumerators' instruction book was as follows:-

"A PERMANENT building is one which satisfies AT LEAST ONE of the following criteria:-

- (a) the walls are of brick, stone and mortar, concrete breeze blocks or similar materials;
- or (b) the roof is of ceramic tiles, slate, thatch, shingle or concrete;
- or (c) the length of the shortest wall is at least 15 feet".

If vacant structures had none of these characteristics they were ignored by the enumerators as also were dilapidated buildings which were uninhabitable.

## **Room**

Rooms did not include small kitchens less than 6 ft. wide, bathrooms and toilets, sculleries not used for cooking, closets, pantries and store-rooms, landings, halls, lobbies or recesses, offices or shops used solely for business purposes.

A large room divided by a sliding or fixed partition was counted as two rooms. A room divided by curtains or portable screens was counted as one room.

An entry of the number of rooms was also made for communal establishments such as hotels, guest houses, boarding houses, and other places offering accommodation to the public on similar terms. The instructions to enumerators read:-

"Enter ..... the number of rooms in the establishment.

Ask the manager to tell you the number of rooms used by staff and guests for living, eating, or sleeping purposes. Public lounges, dining rooms, private sitting rooms, staff dining and common rooms and bedrooms should be included; store-rooms, offices, kitchens, bathrooms, closets etc should not".

## **Household**

A household was defined in the enumerators' instruction book as follows:-

"A household is —

either one person living alone or a group of persons (who may or may not be related) living at the same address with common housekeeping. Persons staying temporarily with the household are included".

Enumerators were told in their instruction book:-

"You may find varying degrees of common housekeeping. When in doubt the rule to follow is:-

if there is any regular arrangement to share at least one meal a day — regard as one household. Breakfast counts as a meal.

Thus, for example, a boarder who provides his own mid-day and evening meals but has breakfast with the family is not a separate household".

The quarters occupied or normally occupied by a household are termed the household space in the tables which relate to dwellings. In a dwelling which is normally occupied by a number of households any vacant accommodation however broken up has been regarded as comprising a single vacant household space.

## **HOUSEHOLDS SHARING DWELLINGS**

Households which do not occupy the whole of a building include those who share (i) a room or rooms or (ii) a hall, staircase, passage etc. only for access to accommodation or (iii) a hall, staircase, passage etc. not only for access to accommodation

### **Non-private Households**

“Non-private households” comprises all persons who were enumerated in hotels, boarding houses and institutions or otherwise grouped in establishments with some functional purpose other than that of providing food or satisfying other domestic convenience. They include also persons in ships at moorings or anchorage or on coastwise voyages, and a small miscellaneous element. Persons enumerated in non-permanent structures (huts, shacks, tents etc.) or in mobile structures (caravans, houseboats etc.) have been transferred to the residual miscellaneous group in all cases where the structures were not the usual residence of any of the persons present on census night.

### **Household Arrangements**

The census schedule contained the following definitions in regard to household amenities:-

A cooker or cooking stove with an oven.

A kitchen sink permanently connected to a water supply and a waste pipe.

A fixed bath or shower permanently connected to a water supply and a waste pipe.

A hot water supply (to a washbasin or kitchen sink, or bath, or shower) from a heating appliance or boiler which is connected to a piped water supply.

A flush toilet (W.C.) with entrance inside the building.

A flush toilet (W.C.) with entrance outside the building.

A refrigerator.

A deep-freeze cabinet.

### **Ownership and Renting**

Each household was asked to state how they occupied their accommodation. The categories listed (the answer ‘yes’ to be given to one of the categories) were:-

AS AN OWNER OCCUPIER (INCLUDING PURCHASE BY MORTGAGE)

As well as freeholders this category included households which occupied their accommodation on a lease originally granted for, or since extended to, more than 21 years. If the accommodation was held on a shorter lease it should have been included in one of the other categories

BY RENTING IT FROM A STATES COMMITTEE

AS AN UNFURNISHED LETTING FROM A PRIVATE LANDLORD OR COMPANY OR HOUSING ASSOCIATION

AS A FURNISHED LETTING

HELD BY VIRTUE OF EMPLOYMENT

A household should have been included in this category if the accommodation was provided in connection with the employment of a member of the household and would cease to be provided after the employment came to an end. The tied cottage and the caretaker’s flat are examples, as well as accommodation provided by a firm for its employees. This category did not include cases where an employer obtained the accommodation for an employee, without any condition as to employment.

Where a person obtained the accommodation by virtue of his employment, but had since retired from or left that employment the household should still have been included in this category. Generally, such accommodation would be occupied for a limited period after the particular employment came to an end.

RENTED TOGETHER WITH A FARM OR BUSINESS PREMISES.

Dwellings have been classified by tenure according to the tenure of the household(s) which occupied them. If the dwelling was shared by more than one household its tenure was regarded as being that of the household whose tenure appeared first on the following ranked list of tenure categories:- owner-occupied; rented from a States Committee; as an unfurnished letting from a private landlord or company or Housing Association; as a furnished letting; held by virtue of employment; rented together with a farm or business premises.



### **Economically Active Population**

The economically active population are those persons over school leaving age who were in employment during the week before the Census and those who though intending to get work were out of employment (including those who were out of employment because of sickness) at the time of the Census. Those in employment include members of the Armed Forces and also people who worked for only a few hours a week (such as a housewife who helped in her husband's shop or did some office cleaning). They also include people temporarily laid off by their employer and those temporarily away from their jobs because of holidays, sickness, strikes, etc.

The economically active population does not include people who were not in employment at the time of the Census, nor intending to get work, even though they regularly worked at other times of the year, for example, in shops at Christmas or on farms at harvest time. People at school or university during term time were excluded even if they did paid work during the holidays, weekends, or other free time. These, and all other persons who were not included among the economically active are described as the economically inactive population.

### **Employment Status Groups**

The economically inactive and active populations are each divided into a number of status groups. These are based on the classifications by employment status and by economic position, full definitions of which are given in "Classification of Occupations, 1970" (H.M.S.O. 1970). A shortened list of definitions is given below.

#### **Economically Inactive**

**Institution Inmates:** Inmates of institutions returning a former occupation but not stated to be retired, who are known or assumed to be withdrawn from employment for a period of six months or more. The kind of institution where such people are mainly found are psychiatric hospitals, hospitals for the chronic sick and places of detention.

**Retired:** Formerly occupied persons who ceased to be employed before the 25th April, 1971, and who were not expecting to work again; women retired due to marriage are excluded.

**Students in Educational Establishments:** Persons above the compulsory education age of 15, who were full-time students in educational establishments.

**Other persons economically inactive:** All other persons without paid occupation or former occupation including housewives and children under compulsory school leaving age.

#### **Economically Active**

**Out of Employment:** Economically active persons out of employment during the whole of the week before the census, or ceasing to be employed during that week i.e., those not self-employed, nor having an employer, but expecting to work again.

(a) Sick

Those included above who were sick or prevented by disability from seeking work for the whole of the week preceding the Census.

(b) Other

The remainder.

#### **In Employment**

**Self-Employed:** Persons not employed by any person or company and persons working in their own home for an employer (out-workers). The self-employed without employees are those who work without paid assistance other than family workers. Out-workers are included.

**Employees:** All persons not self-employed by the above definitions.

Apprentices, articulated clerks and formal trainees, are people undergoing training for a period fixed in advance, leading to recognition as a skilled worker, or technician and/or to a recognised technical, commercial or professional qualification or management post.

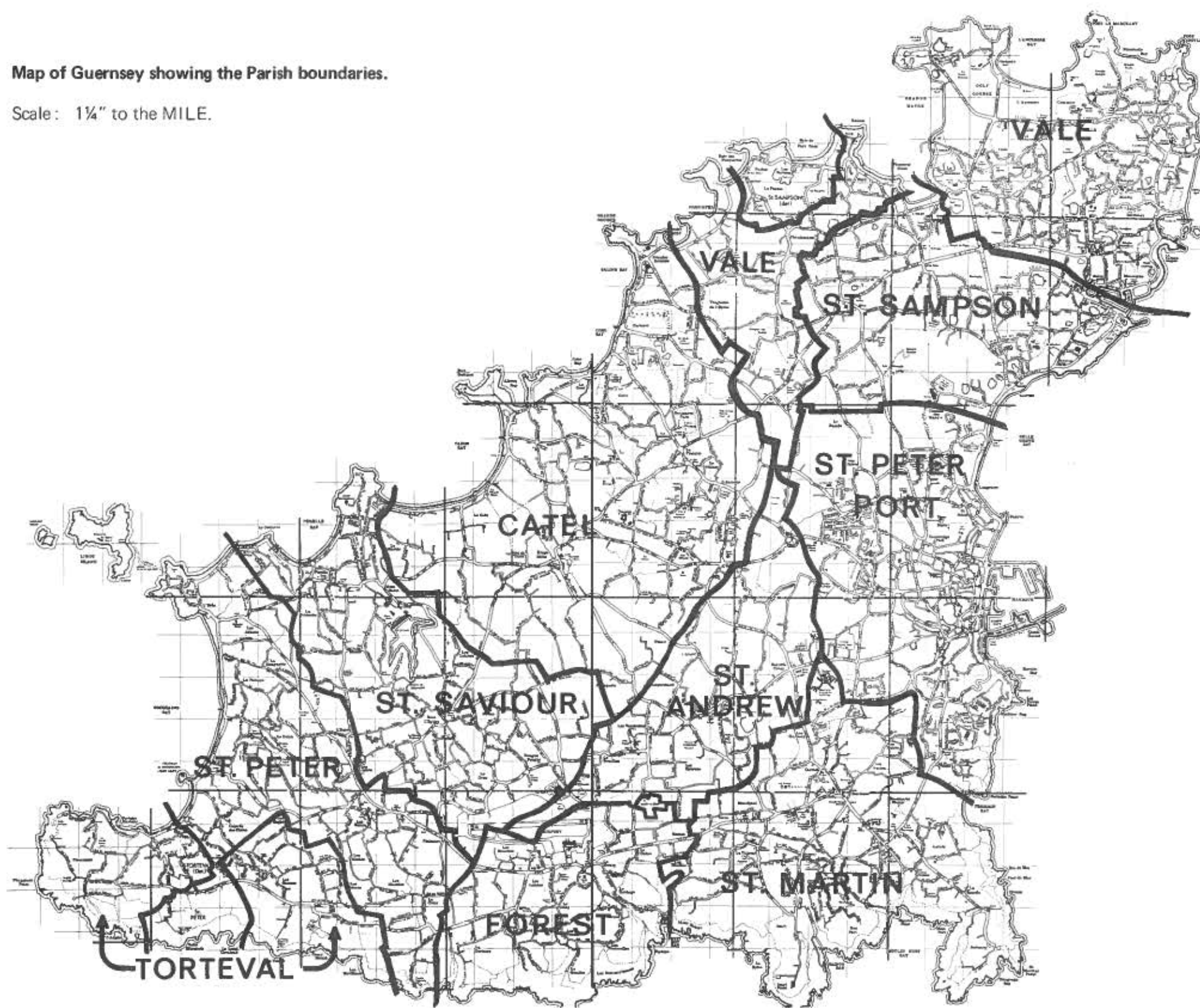
**Family Workers:** These are occupied persons working full-time or part-time who are relatives of their employer living in the same household as he.

### **Classifications of Occupation and Industry**

The occupational descriptions used in some of the tables are based on the "Classification of Occupations, 1970" (H.M.S.O. 1970). The industrial descriptions are based on the revised edition of the "Standard Industrial Classification" (H.M.S.O. 1968).

## H Form For Private Households

**To the Head (or Acting Head) of the Household.**

Please complete this form and have it ready for collection on Monday 26th April. If you need help, do not hesitate to ask the enumerator.

The enumerator may ask you any questions necessary to help him to complete or correct the form.

The information you give on the form will be treated as CONFIDENTIAL and used only for compiling statistics. No information about named individuals will be passed by the Census Office to any other States Committee or any other authority or person. If anyone in the census organisation improperly discloses information you provide, he will be liable to prosecution. Similarly you must not disclose information which anyone (for example, a visitor or boarder) gives you to enable you to complete the form.

The legal obligation to fill in the whole form rests on YOU, but each person who has to be included is required to give you the information you need. However, anyone who wishes can ask the enumerator or local Census Office for a personal form which can be returned direct to the enumerator or local Census Office and then you need answer only questions B1 and B5 for that person.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTE**

There are penalties for failing to comply with the requirements described above, or for giving false information.

**NOTES**

These notes are to help you answer some of the questions in Part B (for persons present). In cases where they also apply to Part C (absent persons) this is shown in Part C.

If you have any further difficulty with these, or any other questions, please ask the enumerator about them when he calls to collect your form.

**B7 Job last week**

A job means any work for payment or profit. In particular it includes:

- (a) work on a person's own account
- (b) part-time work, even if only for a few hours, such as jobbing gardening or paid domestic work
- (c) casual or temporary work of any kind (for example seasonal work, week-end work and vacation work by students)
- (d) unpaid work in a family business, for example a shop or farm. Unpaid work, other than in a family business, does not count as a job.

**B8 Students**

Do not count as full-time students people who are:

- (a) on day release from work to attend school or college
- (b) attending night school only
- (c) attending an educational establishment provided by employers, such as an apprenticeship school.

**B15 Employer's name and business**

Describe the business fully and try to avoid abbreviations or initials. General terms such as 'manufacturer', 'merchant', 'agent', 'broker', 'factor', 'dealer', 'engineering', are not enough by themselves and further details should be given about the articles manufactured or dealt in.

For employees of States Committees and other public officials give the name of the department or public body in which they are employed.

For people employed solely in private domestic service write 'PRIVATE' in answer to this question.

For members of Armed Forces see special note overleaf.

**B16 Occupation**

Full and precise details of occupation are required.

If a person's job is known in the trade or industry by a special name use that name.

Terms such as 'scientist', 'technician', 'engineer', 'machinist', 'fitter', 'foreman', 'checker' should not be used by themselves. Greater detail is required as for example:

woodworking machinist, civil engineer, toolroom foreman.

For civil servants and other public officials give their rank or grade.

**B17 Self-employed**

'Self-employed, employing others' means having one or more employees other than 'family workers'. A 'family worker' is one who lives in the same household as the employer and is related to him. Although 'family workers' are not counted for the purpose of deciding whether an employer has employees, they should themselves be recorded as employees.

# 1971 CENSUS — BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY

## L Form For Hotels, Boarding Houses, Hospitals, Schools and Institutions, etc.

### To the Manager, Chief Resident Officer or other person in charge:

The census depends on the co-operation of those taking part in it and you have certain legal obligations for the enumeration of the people in your establishment. The instructions in the next column tell you how to carry out the enumeration of your establishment and should be followed carefully. If you need help, do not hesitate to ask the enumerator.

The Personal forms with which you will also have been supplied are for the individual returns to be made by each person in the establishment. To assist you in issuing and collecting them, spaces have been provided overleaf for listing the people who spend the night of the 25th/26th April at this address.

### Legal obligations

You have a legal obligation to list the names of the people in your establishment, to distribute forms to them and collect the forms on completion, to see that forms are completed for persons who are incapable of completing them for themselves, and to give the enumerator the information he needs to carry out his duties.

There is a penalty for refusing to deliver or fill in a Census form or refusing to give information for that purpose or for giving false information.

### Confidentiality

The information given on a Census form will be treated as CONFIDENTIAL and used only for compiling statistics. No information about named individuals will be passed by the Census Office to any other States Committee or any other authority or person. If anyone in the census organisation improperly discloses information, he will be liable to prosecution.

You must not use the information given on the completed forms or disclose it to anyone other than the enumerator. If you do, you will be liable to prosecution and, on conviction, may be fined.
